**Church Painting** I would like to paint our church for the parish's 125th anniversary next year, and some have asked why the church needs this. It's a good question. **First**, it's been more than fifty years

since the church was last painted (the last time anyone actually remembers a paint job was in 1958). Many spots are peeling or stained with soot streaks from the candles, and the 24-carat gold trim (one of our church's treasures) is tarnished over in most areas. Our church is certainly quite beautiful, and for the most part well-maintained. But the interior and exterior paint is one area where God's house on Geary Boulevard needs a little more TLC. Second, the church can be quite dark and dreary on a cloudy day. and the lighting is not quite sufficient at night to read a missal in some places. We've priced various lighting proposals but to do a proper lighting upgrade (as St. Ignatius, St. Dominic's and St. Monica have done) would be quite expensive (because we have no hanging fixtures in the nave of the church). Artists have told me that simply painting a lighter color will brighten the interior sufficiently. Third, the exterior is a bit worse for wear with water stains, mold, and corrosion. FAASTAR Gift A benefit dinner will follow my installation Mass on August 25 to raise some funds. But already our Filipino Group, FAASTAR, has made the

first large gift. Estrelle Chan handed me a

check for \$5000 last week to get our fund going, and I will add a thousand of my own. We are thinking of paving the greenway with commemorative bricks as well. If you would like to support the painting (and possibly flooring) project,

and maybe get your name on a brick, call the office. or come to the dinner on Aug. 25.

We have only the Blessed Sacrament in this life. All else is straw. In today's opening section, Jesus feeds the five thousand with bread from heaven. 
