Our Lady of the Rosary Yesterday many of us joined our Archbishop in consecrating the Archdiocese of San Francisco to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. It was October 7, the Feast of Our Lady of the

Rosary. You can't see it now, but if you live long enough, you will see how San Francisco will change because of this Consecration. In 1979 I was 17 years old and traveled to Los Angeles from my family's farm in Pennsylvania to participate in a 30-day retreat. I did it partly because my mother encouraged me to do so but more because I wanted the excitement of Southern California. After a month of catechesis and prayer, I was not much more aware of my faith than before the retreat, but I made the consecration with at least a willing spirit. That small act of faith on my part, and the immense grace of the consecration itself, gradually led my life from hell to heaven. Had I not been consecrated before beginning college at a big eastern university, I certainly would have fallen into drugs and sex, and the unhappy life of so many of my generation. The consecration put a desire into my heart for daily Mass and daily rosary, which I have been doing since that retreat almost forty years ago.

Lourdes and Fatima I actually write this column from Fatima on October 2, listening to the rosary procession from my open window. We return to San Francisco tomorrow, having completed a 15-day pilgrimage to Lourdes and Fatima. We have been renewed in our love for Holy Mary and her Divine Son, preparing for the Consecration on October 7. I tell you, this consecration will have lasting good effects for our City. Will you be a part of this goodness and beauty? Will you share this joy with your children and grandchildren? Pray the rosary every day. Begin coming to daily Mass. A young family in Fatima asked me to bless their children. Do you pray the rosary daily? I asked. "Just a decade," they said. "But from now on, we resolve to pray at least two decades every night." Can you make the same resolution? Consecrate yourself to our Lady in this, our hour of need!

Principle's Letter

This week we celebrate the feast of our city's holy patron, St. Francis of Assisi. I grew up in my Catholic school, St. Patrick's in San Jose, listening to the Prayer of St. Francis during Mass. It is one of my favorite songs to sing. In fact, I am listening to it now as I write. As the lyrics fill this room, I realize I have had the job of being a peacemaker for quite a long time. After all, I worked in the 5th-grade classroom for over a decade. During the course of that time, I watched the power of peace in action — which was most often during the ten minutes

after recess.

Ten-year-olds, you see, are amazing people. They are so readily able to discover a place of peace among themselves in times of utter discord with their neighbor. Even though they can be the worst at holding grudges about wrongs done as far back as preschool, it always amazed me when I witnessed how they still found ways to peacefully and cooperatively work together in the classroom simply because it is what we ask of them at Star. In short, we ask them to practice the healing power of forgiveness, and often miraculously, they rise to expectation.

So, as I listen to St. Francis's Prayer, I realize just how fitting the prayer is when I consider the work we are meant to do at Star this year. The song is a call to the greatest form of love, one that transcends old hurts and pain. One that reminds us of what we as Catholic Christians strive to do: to be an instrument of God's peace, To show love where there is hatred, to bring harmony to discord, to pardon an injury to bring truth where there is falsehood, to show faith during times of doubt, to clasp onto hope when there is despair, to bring light into darkness and to find joy despite heart rendering sadness.

"Jesus came into the world to learn how to be a man, and by being a man, to walk with men. He came into the world to obey, and He obeyed.... Through this obedience, this self-abnegation, this humiliation, through Jesus...the people of God walk with sure hope. Even His Mother ... in order to participate in her Son's journey, learned, suffered, and obeyed. And thus she becomes Mother.... And this is our hope ... Mother Church is anointed when she takes the same path as Jesus and Mary: the path of obedience, the path of suffering, and when she has the attitude of continually learning the path of the Lord. These two, Mary and the Church, carry on the hope that is Christ, they give us Christ ... Without Mary, there would be no Jesus Christ; without the Church, we cannot go forward."
