Time is Prayer Remember? We are on the third and final week of our annual Stewardship Renewal. Two weeks ago we planned the Time in prayer we commit to God this year. Last week we planned the Talent we will share with

the parish in one or more ways. This week we plan that portion of treasure we will make to God this year.

Treasure Everybody loves treasure. When I was a boy my brothers and I found an old wooden box with rusty metal clasps. We poured our saved-up pennies into the box and buried it in the ground. Then we called some of the littler kids from the neighborhood and went on a treasure hunt. We dug up the box, brushed away the dirt, and flung upon the lid. The little kids went wild as we poured hundreds of shiny copper pennies into their hands. We had discovered hidden treasure!

A principle of Christian stewardship is discovering that hidden treasure. God pours his blessings upon us day by day, but these treasures remain largely hidden to us. We rush from one distraction to another, missing the graces all around us. When we take the time to still our racing hearts even for a moment, we discover those treasures. The sun. The clouds. Good health. Ailments that bring wisdom and depth. The people we like. The people we don't like, whose rough edges refine us. I was visiting a young man who had tried to kill himself the other day. He is a gentle soul, a good-hearted man, but trauma-

tized by a dysfunctional family. We prayed the rosary for fifteen minutes in the psychiatric ward, and in that quiet moment both witnessed to the enduring providence of God. What a treasure!

Money What does this have to do with money? Well, once we recognize our blessings, we want to share them, even our money. At Mass today I'm going to tell my story. I began tithing 15 years ago when I realized that giving some of my money to God was simple justice. It's really not my money, and I know now that He will always provide. Tithing freed me from worry and given me peace. I want you all to have that peace too.

Five virgins were foolish—they let their prayer lives get so lazy that they ran out of oil. Do you know where we refill our oil lamps every week? In the adoration chapel. That is our clean, well-lit place where we receive light and love, enough to keep our lamps lit another week.

Come to the Table!

A note on the Communion Rail from our pastor

A year ago we priests began offering you the option of receiving Holy Communion at the altar rail as well as in the line. Our church has retained the beautiful Communion Rail from which our grandmothers and great uncles and many generations received Jesus before us. It's a comfort to many of us to kneel or stand at the edge of the sanctuary, stilling our hearts in anticipation of Jesus' coming to us. I think of the Communion Rail as a table, and all of us have taken our places together at this table to be fed by God. Coming all together to this "table" seems more communal than coming up in a line. Lines are for post offices and movie theaters and supermarkets! Tables are for families. In any case, to avoid confusion, I propose we all come to the altar rail for Holy Communion. You can stand or kneel (some of course cannot kneel), and you can receive on the tongue or the hand. But I think it's best that we all "come to the Table" rather than standing in line for Holy Communion. Of course, most of you area already coming to the rail for Holy Communion, but I'd like to begin having everyone come to the rail, either kneeling or standing, on the hand or on the tongue, in a month of so. Let me know what you think.


