In my 27 years in the priesthood I've always delighted to see how many people come to Mass on Thanksgiving morning. Truly we know to whom we are rendering thanks. To offer the Lord God a sacrifice of praise at the Holy Mass is the essence of our national holiday. How sad to be an atheist on Thanksgiving! Wikipedia tells us that our nation's first Thanksgiving was at Plymouth Rock in 1621. Certainly the image of Native Americans and newlyarrived Pilgrims sitting down together warms our hearts. But an earlier thanksgiving meal between Europeans and Native Americans took place 56 years before that. 800 Spanish colonists had landed on August 28, 1565, at a beach in what is now Florida. They named their settlement "St. Augustine" after the saint of that day, This town of 14,000 is the oldest European settlement in our country. On September 8 these colonists offered the first Mass on our continent, and after this supreme act of thanksgiving to God, sat down for a meal with members of the Timucuan tribe. We offer the same Holy Mass on Thanksgiving Day this week at



10am, thanking God for his manifold blessings and praying for peace in our nation. On Thursday I will read President Lincoln's inspiring Thanksgiving proclamation of 1863, as I do every year.

Come to the Table!

A note on the Communion Rail from our pastor

A year ago we priests began offering you the option of receiving Holy Communion at the altar rail as well as in the line. Our church has retained the beautiful Communion Rail from which our grandmothers and great uncles and many generations received Jesus before us. It's a comfort to many of us to kneel or stand at the edge of the sanctuary, stilling our hearts in anticipation of Jesus' coming to us. I think of the Communion Rail as a table, and all of us have taken our places together at this table to be fed by God. Coming all together to this "table" seems more communal than coming up in a line. Lines are for post offices and movie theaters and supermarkets! Tables are for families. In any case, to avoid confusion, I propose we all come to the altar rail for Holy Communion. You can stand or kneel (some of course cannot kneel), and you can receive on the tongue or the hand. But I think it's best that we all "come to the Table" rather than standing in line for Holy Communion. Of course, most of you area already coming to the rail for Holy Communion, but I'd like to begin having everyone come to the rail, either kneeling or standing, on the hand or on the tongue, starting Advent, Sunday December 3rd. Let me know what you think.
