I recently attended a titanic conference on Pope Paul's 1968 encyclical *Humanae vitae*, whose 50th anniversary we observed last Wednesday. 700 people from around the country filled the Ontario

Conference Center to talk about the Pope's ban on birth control. But hasn't that train already left? Have we not all seen Monte Python's lampoon "Every Sperm is Sacred"? Indeed we are quite used to the world's mockery of the Catholic imagination. Imagine that every little bitty thing, every *thing that is*, is sacred, a sacrament of God's infinite beauty. **The**

Holy Mass Well, we began our conference at 7am with Holy Mass. Sitting in the front row of our packed room was a young couple and their 13-month old daughter, Luz. She was locked in a epic struggle with gravity, her first attempts to keep all 24 inches of her towering body upright. I must say, she didn't seem to appreciate the gravity of the moment. She smiled, she laughed, she fell down and bounced back. She rejoiced to discover that she could walk, that she could escape the floor and break free of gravity's shackles. Precisely at the moment of consecration, as the priest lifted the Body of Christ high above his head, baby Luz was dancing, flying, soaring before the altar! **Dancing and Flying** One had the sense of dancing and flying as we gathered in plenary sessions to talk about *Humanae vitae*. Human life is God's gift of flight, of

escaping the bonds of earth. We live in a

culture of death, spawned largely by contraception: by the separation of sex from babies, by the divorce of the marital act from the generation of new life. It was baby Luz, laughing as she took her first steps into this world, giggling as she bumped against the altar during Mass, that made our conference on *Humanae vitae* vital. It was her beautiful young parents, who have dared to bring four children into this dark world, children who will sprinkle light wherever they dance. Do not believe for one minute that another child is a curse, an enemy, a disease, a "mistake." Bravely conceive babies; have as many as you can, and glorify God in your bodies!

Men's Retreat with Knights of Columbus

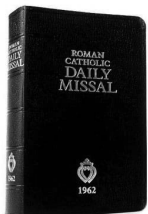

The Sunday Scriptures

by Fr. Joseph Illo **Bread of Life** (Exodus 16: 2-4, 12-15, Ephesians 4: 17, 20-24, John 6: 24-35) Today's Gospel is the second of our five Sunday tour through John 6, the great Eucharistic chapter in the New Testament. Last Sunday, Jesus multiplied 5 loaves to feed 5 thousand men. Today he goes a step further: "I am the bread of life." Ordinary bread will not save your lives; in fact, every carbohydrate we eat kills us (oxidizes us) just a little. Only the supernatural bread, which is Christ, can get us across the waters of earthly death to eternal life. Without the Holy Eucharist, which is in every Catholic tabernacle, we eat death.

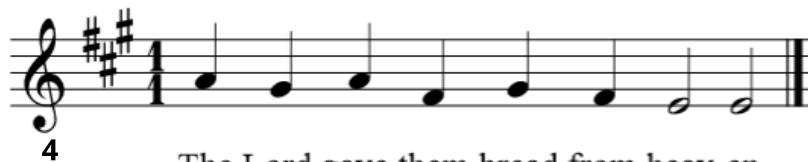

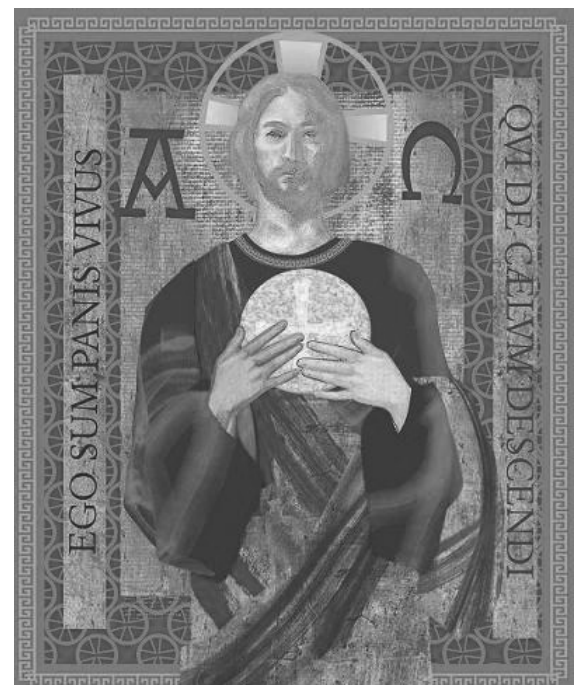
