We Welcome Bishop Christian A warm Star Welcome to Bishop Robert Christian, who installs me this weekend as your



pastor! Bishop Christian is a much-loved San Franciscan whom many of us have known from our studies at the Dominican University in Rome. I have enjoyed

working with his brother, Mr. John Christian, who manages the Archdiocesan real estate department. One of our priests quipped that “now we have at least two Christians working in the chancery”(!). At the installation Mass, the Bishop asks the new pastor: “Will you celebrate the mysteries of Christ reverently and faithfully, in accord with the tradition of the Church? Will you unite yourself every day **more closely** to Christ the High Priest, who offered Himself to the Father as a pure sacrifice?” Please pray that I and all pastors will unite ourselves more closely every day to Christ’s pure sacrifice. When my priestly life becomes less sacrificial, less pure and less holy, please (gently) correct me. We priests are clothed in weak humanity; we depend not only on your encouragement but also your loving correction. Don’t wait until your priests and bishops stray far from Christ, and then express shocked outrage. Help us

now, every day, to be good and holy.

A Cleansing If you were at Mass last Sunday, you heard the Archbishop’s sober letter concerning the crimes of bishops and priests. We are only at the beginning of our Church’s cleansing, and I’ve no doubt that a more damning report than we saw in Pennsylvania will come out on California’s clergy. As painful as this will be, this purging will lead to purer, more sacrificial, and more Christlike clergy and laity. Let us welcome the purification.

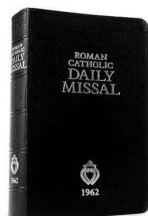

We renovate our homes every fifteen or twenty years, so let us all pitch in to give our Lord's house a brighter and newer demeanor. Star of the Sea Preschool Openings

Star of the Sea Preschool currently has part and full-time openings for children 2.5 to 5 years old. We provide a Montessori environment where children can choose activities they are drawn to, and we teach the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd.

Recognizing that childhood is a critical period in human development, Star of the Sea Preschool provides an environment in which children can grow and develop at their own rate, develop a positive self-image, learn to express emotion in an appropriate way, act on their environment, develop a sense of responsibility, and learn to trust those around them.

The Star of the Sea Preschool faculty and administrators work closely with the Elementary staff to insure a smooth transition to Kindergarten at Star Elementary as well as with other public and private programs.
