Cardinal Arinze On the 30th of this month we will receive a distinguished and distinctive visitor, His Eminence Francis Arinze, the retired Nigerian Cardinal who

oversaw the Church's Congregation for Divine Worship for many years. We will of course welcome him to the City which also bears the name "Francis," the poor friar from Assisi. Here's a little wisdom from his latest book (*The Evangelizing Parish*), which I have just ordered and will read before he arrives: "The way in which the priest celebrates Mass becomes, in a sense, a homily without words because it



manifests his faith. If he has great reverence for Jesus in this sacrifice and sacrament, and if he respects the liturgical laws and directives of the Church in all that touches his Eucharistic

ministration, such an approach of faith will be shown to the people in a convincing way." Cardinal Arinze will speak at 6pm on October 30 at Star.

Astonishment at the Mystery Now if you haven't noticed, our parish has given special focus to Reverence and Mystery in the Sacred Liturgical Rites. The surest way back to God is through *right worship*, or "ortho-doxy" in Greek. Orthopraxis (right

living) follows Orthodoxy (right worship). Or, as Mother Teresa would say, "if our prayer life is right, everything else will be perfectly alright." But our prayer life in the Catholic Church has not been right for some time. Most Catholics do not come to Mass regularly, and those of us who do have had to settle for a less-than-prayerful Masses. Over this summer we Catholics have seen with horror that the Church is in a swamp of impurity and criminal abuse. All of us have gradually accepted an increase of worldliness among our bishops and priests, which has inevitably led to a pervasive impurity (because, after all, most Catholic lay people also settle for sexual impurity either in their own lives or in the lives of their family and friends). The surest way out of this swamp is a return to greater reverence and heartfelt prayer at Mass: deeply beautiful music, Holy Communion received on our knees, devout silence of mind and body during the Holy Sacrifice. We *can* regain our innocence and astonishment at the Mystery of Christ's sacrifice!

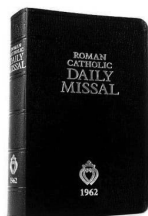

The Sunday Scriptures

by Fr. Joseph Illo **Looked With Love** (Wisdom 7: 7-11, Hebrews 4: 12-13, Mark 10: 17-30) Today's gospel story is one of my favorites: a rich young man throws himself on his knees before Jesus with a burning question: "What must I do to get to heaven?" Jesus looked at him, but the Bible says looked at him *with love*. Why? Because Jesus was going to ask something difficult of him: to give everything he owned to the poor. Has God similarly asked something great from you? He takes your health, or your marriage, or your job? If you have trouble giving it back to Him, go to the Blessed Sacrament, where He *looks at us with love*. You will find the blessing.
