Welcome Fr. Myron

You may not know but our parish supports a "sister parish" in Russia, which is the Holy Mother of God Cathedral parish in Vladivostok. In 1991

two American clergy (Father Myron Effing and Brother Dan Mauer) gave up security and comfort in the States to dedicate the rest of their lives to reviving the faith in Eastern Russia. One of Mikhail Gorbachev's democratic reforms in the early 1990s was to return church buildings to their original owners, and so he offered the old Catholic Cathedral of Vladivostok to whomever wanted to fix it



parish with seven new parishes throughout the Archdiocese of Vladivostok. The Soviets had used the cathedral building itself as a Russian state archive and these two priests had to raise funds to renovate it for Masses again. Fr. Myron established a religious community of sisters and brothers for this work and built a monastery next to the cathedral,

along with dozens of apostolates to serve the poor of the city. This Sunday we welcome Fr. Myron to preach at all our Masses. He entered Russia a middle-aged man and has given his strength over 30 years for the people of Russia, whom he loves. 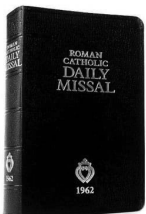
