to pray for our missionaries in the Russian Far East as they rebuild a Christian civilization from the ashes of communism. **Stewardship of Time (in Prayer)** Praying for the people of Russia is a good use of our time. The good God gives us 168 hours a week, and every year in our parish we fill out a little worksheet, called a "stewardship commitment form," to evaluate how we are using God's gift of time. First things first: we should give God

the first hour of our day, so to speak, in spending time with Him in prayer. Medical studies demonstrate that those who give their first hour of the week (on Sunday, the first day of the week) to prayer are healthier, happier, and stronger than those who do not go to church weekly. If you have not received your stewardship packet in the mail, with those commitment forms, you can get one at the office. Next Sunday I will ask you to spend a few minutes thinking about your Stewardship of Time in Prayer, and to fill out those forms in Mass with me. I hope your heart will be open to honestly considering your prayer life next Sunday.

Cardinal Arinze This week, however, I want you to give an hour of your time on Tuesday to listen carefully to Cardinal Francis Arinze, who will be speaking at 6pm on Tuesday in the church. This Nigerian cardinal headed up the Church's Office for Worship for many years, given the task by Pope John Paul II to teach the world how to pray well. He will speak about the Sacred Liturgy and how Christians can pray well. Only about 20% of you at Sunday Masses attend these speakers' events. I tell you that your are hurting yourself by not attending. Uneducated Catholics are the reason the Church is riddled with scandals. So come on Tuesday and help rebuild the Church and rebuild your own prayer life, so that none of us goes to hell after we die. **School Board** Congratulations to the nine new members of our School Board (listed on p. 2). May God be with us as we grow!

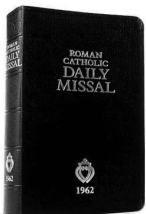

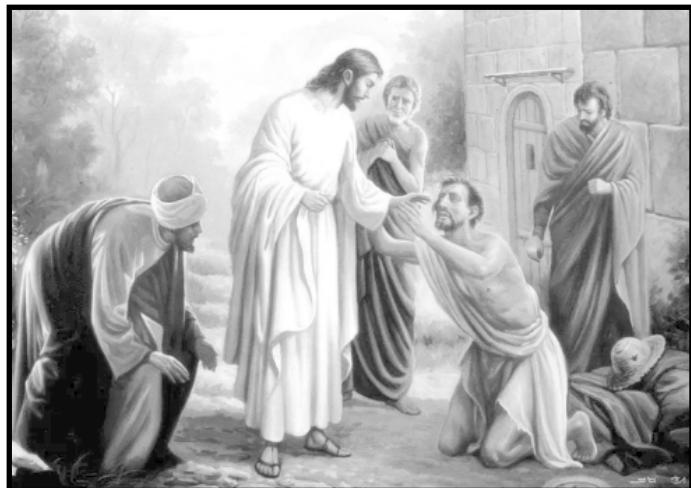
