**All Saints Masses** Last Thursday the Universal Church celebrated All Saints Day, on which we offered two particularly beautiful Masses. First was our School Mass at which our children

choristers sang classic Catholic music, as if by angels. Our school hosted the first **Chant Camp** of its kind in California, training children in music theory, Gregorian Chant, and sacred polyphony. You've got to hear it to believe it! We plan to have our new school choir sing at the 9:30 Mass once a month from November onward. The second extraordinary All Saints liturgy was a Solemn High Mass with our excellent adult choir, at which we welcomed Fr. Cassian as subdeacon. Let us pray and work for even greater fidelity and excellence to Christ's sacred liturgy.

The end of October brought our month of the Holy Rosary to an end, and now in November we focus on the **holy souls** in

purgatory, all on their way to becoming **saints** in heaven. Last week I gave a retreat to a hundred deacons and wives of the Diocese of Fresno. These honest men and women, so faithful to the Church and dedicated to Our Lord and Our Lady, gave me so much joy and hope. We studied the history and message of **Our Lady of Fatima**. She began on July 13, 1917 by showing the children a vision of hell: strong medicine for anyone. They saw with their own eyes that hell is real, and many souls are lost because no one prays for them. But six months later she showed them a vision of heaven, assuring the three children that their souls were safe. "Many more will go to heaven if you pray for them" she said, and then revealed her name, "Our Lady of the Rosary." Let us pray and offer sacrifices for all the men, women, and children in our parish and school, that no souls be lost. A "good education," a high ranking high school and college, a good career are all good things, but mean nothing if we end up in hell. *Let us aim for nothing less than heaven!*

### **2nd Annual Thanksgiving Food Drive**

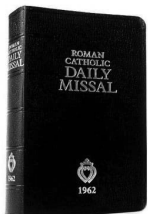
In honor of Thomas, who left a legacy of kindness to

## COMMITMENT WEEKEND

### TIME IN PRAYER FORM Nov. 3 and 4

This weekend we begin our first parish commitment weekend with a focus on TIME IN PRAYER. A short reflection will be given at all Masses.
