Treasure This

Sunday we come to the last of three stewardship commitment weekends. Each year we spend three weeks

planning our gifts to God of time in prayer, talent in service, and treasure in financial support for Christ's Church. Those who have begun by planning their prayer lives and their charitable service find this last act of stewardship, financial giving, relatively easily. If we have not yet developed the habit of giving time in prayer and talent in service, then sharing some of our wealth will be difficult. We always invest our money into that in which we've already invested our time and energy. **The Church's Treasure** The greatest treasure is not money, however, but people. In 258 the Roman Prefect gave St. Lawrence one week to collect for him all the temporal goods of the Church. A week later Lawrence presented the poor of Rome to the Prefect. "Behold the Church's treasure," he said. The Prefect was not amused and had Lawrence burned alive.

Our November Altar The blood of the martyrs proves their conviction that it is in giving that we receive. The early Christian churches were all built over the tombs of martyrs, and later as parish communities developed, most churches would set aside ground for a cemetery, or *camposanto* ("holy ground"). Our November Altar—Our Lady's altar decorated with flowers and photographs

of the dead to the left of the main altar—is our own little *camposanto*. Every day this month I kneel before these pictures and light a candle for my Nana and Uncle Frank, and for every person remembered there. Seeing these beautiful faces has brought all parishioners into deeper communion with each other. We cannot help but love the living as we pray with and for the dead. Every person portrayed on our November Altar is a miracle of life and gift of God. We see God Himself in the images of these loved ones who have passed over the waters of earthly death and are now with Him. Praying for their souls also helps us anticipate our own destiny. Our society both fantasizes about death (think of the zombie and vampire movies) and avoids even a mention of the fact of death. But keeping images of the deceased *on an altar* changes hopeless dread of our own death into joyful hope of heaven. These images point to our first principle and final end. We know where we have come from and we know where we are going. "The souls of the just are in the hands of God," the Bible assures us in Wisdom 3. "For grace and mercy are with His chosen ones, and His care is with His elect." *Fr. Joseph Illo* www.frilloblog.com

Worldwide Marriage Encounter Weekend

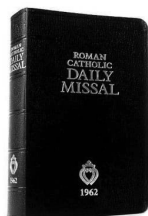

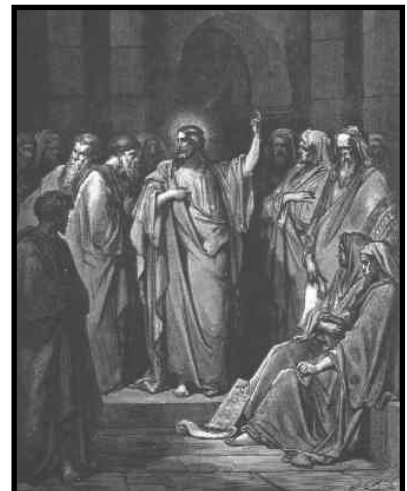
