The Immaculata In two days I will be 57 years old but I still feel like a boy. I guess that is because my mother is alive and well, and they say when your mother dies you become an old

man. She still tells me how to drive, for example, and when she leaves my life I will feel a lot older. It is at those times that I don't listen respectfully to my mother that I feel old. One great gift from both my dear parents is my Catholic faith, but in particular my mother taught me how to pray to the Mother of God. As long as we love our Mother in heaven, we are young. Even when our earthly mothers leave us, we need not lose our childlike simplicity because the Blessed Mother looks after us.

My mother named me Joseph because I was born in December (St. Joseph is the unsung hero of Christmas). Isn't it lovely when parents name their children after the liturgical season or nearest saint's day? In December we have two lovely feasts of Our Lady, in addition to Christmas. This Saturday will be the **Immaculate Con**ception (Dec. 8), and the following

Wednesday Our Lady of Guadalupe (Dec. 12). December 8 is a Holy Day of Obligation, but because it is a Saturday this year we have only one parish Mass, at 8:30am. But I personally am going to the Archbishop's 2pm Mass at St. Mary's Cathedral, which will of course fulfill the obligation. I encourage you to attend that Mass too, which will feature the Cathedral Choir

singing a new Mass of the Americas, the Missa Guadalupana, by composer Frank La Rocca. The Cathedral should be full of pilgrims who will have walked the 12 miles from South San Francisco, just as St. Juan Diego had walked the 12 miles for Mass on Dec 9, 1531, when he encountered the beautiful Lady clothed with the sun. We celebrate our own Guadalupe Mass on her feast day, December 12, at 6am, followed by a Mexican breakfast and mariachi in the auditorium. December is a fine month to honor the Mother of God, for the more honor given her, the more simple joy comes into our childlike hearts. The Baltimore Bishops Although the


