Epiphany of Our Lord (229 in the Black Missal)



The Shining Epiphany, which we celebrate to-day, means "the shining out" in Greek. The Star shone from the East, pointing to the child in Bethlehem. I pray that Star of the Sea will shine

out across the San Francisco Bay in 2019, revealing the sacred presence of God among us. Grace and mercy flow through

Word and Sacrament, found in their fullness in the Catholic Church, despite all her weariness and corruption. Every Christian family, every parish, and every Christian community has the mission to shine out God's grace and mercy.

Fidelity But how faithful will we be this year? Last October's attendance count showed fewer people at Sunday Mass than

the previous year (we had been growing on average by 8% a year since 2014). Those who do faithfully attend, however, are shining brightly. They have overcome the stigma of attending a "conservative" parish in San Francisco. They treasure Eucharistic adoration; they understand why the priest "turns his back" during the Eucharistic Prayer; they have come to love singing from the treasury of Catholic sacred music; they serve the poor because they first serve God in prayer, and they show greater patience with the trouble-

some because they have disciplined their wills with fasting and penance. The prayerful silence within our church and the warm fellowship within our parish are lovely. We are a school of prayer and service. **Spreading the Faith** But keeping the faith to ourselves does not get us into heaven. Christ commanded us to *spread* His Gospel. Comparatively few of us have taken the next step in discipleship, which is to *give* the grace and truth that we have

received. If we are not growing, we are dying. Take Eucharistic Adoration: unless more people commit to an hour of prayer a week, we will have to shut down some periods of exposition. Some of us need to take the joy of **Eucharistic Adoration into** the streets, and promote it in other parishes, if we are to keep the monstrance on the altar all day every day. The stakes are getting higher in the war on religion; the Church's enemies gladly

seize upon the sins of our leaders to attack the Body of Christ. In the next ten years parishes will be eliminated in San Francisco and Catholic schools will close. I can't see more than a few steps ahead in these dark times, but I do know that God commands us all to do more than pray. Having received the Eucharist, we must bring God's grace and mercy to those not at Mass. May God show us how He would have us grow his Church in this year of grace 2019! *Fr. 
