The Walk for Life

West Coast Two weeks from now San Francisco will host the second-largest prolife gathering in our nation. How can we thank our two dedicated

parishioners, **Eva Muntean** and **Dolores Meehan**, for establishing this great and joyous annual event fourteen years ago? Walk for Life is an entire weekend of joyful witness to the

Gospel of Life. **Friday:** St. Dominic's hosts a Mass and Holy Hour at 5pm; Saints Peter and Paul holds all-night adoration in their gorgeous church.

Saturday: The Archbishop offers Mass at the Cathedral at 9:30am; Civic Center hosts a rally with topnotch speakers at 11am (our thanks to Mayor Breed and the City), followed by the Walk itself. Our own parish hosts an open barbeque at 6pm. The Knights of Columbus will provide burgers, dogs, and beans to the whole city, and at 7pm the Sisters of Life from New York will speak. At 7:30 Dr. Pat Kastle of LifeRunners will speak on his meeting with Padre Pio; at 8pm the Sisters will lead a holy hour in the church, and the Holy Eucharist will remain exposed in our open church all night long. Around 250 high school and college students will be camp-



ing out for the weekend on our campus (thanks to Maggie Tuttle and her H4 young adults for coordinating that, and our school for providing the rooms). Unlike other political demonstrations, joy rather than anger, peaceful trust rather than outrage, characterize this event. Eva is looking for leaders who can take over the Walk. Are there people in our own parish family who can help her and Dolores in assuring the Walk grows stronger every year? **The Gabriel Project** Last Sunday the Archbishop's coordinator for

the "Gabriel Project" invited parish coordinators from our three counties to the 9:30 Mass followed by a brunch in our St. Claire room with brief talks. "Project Gabriel" assists women in difficult pregnancies with

food, shelter, clothing, medical attention, and all the resources needed to care for their babies. Some accuse the Church of simply scolding society for committing abortions, but efforts like the Gabriel project demonstrate how much loving care Mother Church provides for all human beings at every stage of development. The Walk for Life, the Gabriel Project, and our Thursday night prayers at the city's only remaining Planned Parenthood abortion clinic are just some of the ways Star of the Sea is building a culture of life here in San Francisco. *Fr. 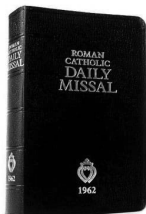
The Preschool faculty and administrators work closely with the Elementary staff to ensure a smooth transition to Kindergarten at Star Elementary as well as with other public and private programs.

Get A Tax Break!

If you are 70 1/2 or older, you can transfer up to \$100,000 from your IRA to charity tax-free, which counts as your required minimum distribution but isn't added to your adjusted gross income. You cannot make a tax-free transfer from your 401(k) to charity, but you can roll over money from your 401(k) to an IRA and then transfer the RMD to charity. Contact your fund manager for details.
