Walk for Life West Coast The day has finally come when San Francisco becomes a festival of life and love! Well over 50,000 will witness to the supreme gift of every human life

by walking down Market Street on Saturday. Legalized abortion in 1973 has led to the destruction of 60 million human

lives. Many of those human persons were small enough to fit in the palm of your hand, and some even small enough to sit on a flower petal. But since when does "small" mean "non-human"? A person's a person no matter how small. If size determines how human we are, then short people are less human than tall people. If age de-

termines how human we are, then twentyyear-olds are less human than eightyyear-olds. If viability determines how human we are, then children and elderly people and mentally-challenged people and sick people are less human. But if the human fetus is even possibly a human being, we should not kill him or her. bulletin, but let me summarize: our Sunday offertory last fiscal year was up 8%. The first half of this fiscal year, our offertory giving increased by 6.4% We managed our expenses and ended the year with a surplus of \$45,000. If you are not already doing so, please begin regular sacrificial tithing to Star of the Sea, both so that we can continue growing the community and so that God can bless you for your trust in Him. The best way to really



commit to steady support for our parish is online giving, which I have been doing since 2014. Only 33 others are giving online with me.



Get A Tax Break!

If you are 70 1/2 or older, you can transfer up to \$100,000 from your IRA to charity tax-free, which counts as your required minimum distribution but isn't added to your adjusted gross income. You cannot make a tax-free transfer from your 401(k) to charity, but you can roll over money from your 401(k) to an IRA and then transfer the RMD to charity. Contact your fund manager for details.

The Sunday Scriptures

by Fr. Joseph Illo **Cana** (Isaiah 62: 1-5, 1 Corint hians 12: 4-11, John 2: 1-11) Today's Gospel is the second Luminous Mystery of the rosary, the Wedding at Cana. Epiphany was two weeks ago, the Baptism of Jesus last week, and today the miracle at Cana all manifest Jesus as Lord. The Epiphany Star, the Father's voice at the Jordan, and the water made wine all reveal this child, this man, as the eternal God. He chose to reveal his glory, to perform his first miracle, at a wedding. Marriage is always the battle ground between good and evil, between truth and falsehood.





This financial report reflects income and expenses from July 1, 2017 to June 30, 2018. I am pleased to see that our tithing rose 8.1% over this period, mostly from Sunday offertory. We leveraged our properties for a healthy increase in rental income as well. One of longtime parishioners, Mrs. Helen Lum, placed Star of the Sea in her will for 8% of her estate, which greatly supported the work of our parish and school. Please keep Helen in your prayers, and all who have remembered Star of the Sea in their wills. Please consider placing your parish in your will, as I did when I moved into Star of the Sea four years ago.

Expenses rose for Fiscal year 2017-18 mostly through increased benefit costs as well as expenses for the school seismic retrofit project. Even though we had more residence in the Rectory, we cut back on utilities, doing our part to save the planet. FY 2017-18 ended with a net operating income of \$45,719.

How are we doing as a community with stewardship of treasure? As mentioned, offertory rose from July 2017 to July 2018 by 8.1%, and over the last six months it has continued to rise another 6.4%. Our average Sunday offering is at \$6,400, and my goal within two years is to see an average Sunday offering of \$7,500, and in four years to reach an average of \$8,800. A good tithe is a *planned* and *consistent* gift to your parish and school. The best way to do that is by using our online giving button on the parish website. Currently only 32 other parishioners have joined me in online giving, but I'd like to see another 30 join the club by this time next year. We are Christian Stewards, meaning that we don't give to a need but *we have a need to give.* I thank the growing number of fellow Catholics who recognize this need to share the abundance of God's gifts and pray that we all work together to bring about a flowering of the faith here in San Francisco.
