

The Sunday Scriptures

by Fr. Joseph Illo **Blessings and Curses** (Jeremiah 17: 5-8; 1 Corinthians 15: 12, 16-20; Luke 6: 17, 20-26)

This Sunday we get Luke's version of the Sermon on the Mount. Christ gives four blessings and four curses, which boil down to *blessed are the poor*, and *cursed are the rich*. Our problem in America is that we are all rich. We are financially secure, at least by global standards. Not one of us is without "discretionary spending." Are we all cursed therefore? The only way out, as I see it, is to give some of our money away—ten percent is the biblical number. Have you ever noticed that those who live *simply* are happier, more peaceful, and more grateful than the rest of us?






