Your Lent In just three days a priest will impose ashes upon our lilywhite foreheads and declare that we are soon to return to dust. Our parish magazine will be arriving at your

doorstep in two weeks with some solid Lenten recommendations, such as Stations of the Cross, fasting from internet and/or sugar and/or alcohol, soup suppers, daily Mass, making a gift to the Anniversary Fund or the AAA, etc. But let me recommend just two things right away. First, go



to Mass on Wednesday-we've got four of them (7:30am, noon, 5:30pm, and 6:30pm). Get your ashes and live like you are dust and ashes. Then God will raise you up to glory! And second, start using FORMED. Or you can listen to a dramatic reading of the Stations of the Cross as you drive to work or ride the bus, or sit in a quiet place at home or even in the church itself, going from station to station with you best friend plugged into your ears. All of this on FORMED. How do you log in? Pick up a card at the church doors to learn how, or see page XX of this bulletin. Spread the good news! Our Lenten Mission FORMED is a digital experience, but in addition, we will have a live, in-the-flesh speaker for you this Lent. Deacon Dominick Peloso, who started Eucharistic Adoration at one of the Bay Area's most dynamic parishes (Nativity in Menlo Park) will be preaching at all the Masses on March 16 & 17. He will speak again at 6pm on March 18, and preach our special St. Joseph's Day Mass on March 19. This will comprise our Lenten Mission, and by now you must know that all Catholics drop whatever they're doing to come to the parish mission during Lent.

The Sunday Scriptures

by Fr. Joseph Illo **Bearing Fruit** (Sirach 27: 4-7, 1 Corinthians 15: 54-58, Luke 6: 39-45) "Who am I to judge?" Certainly these words of Pope Francis come to mind when we hear the Gospel today, about taking the *plank* out of our own eye before attempting to remove the *splinter* in our brother's eye. Pope Francis is not known for precision in language, and what he meant to say, I think, is "Who am I to judge *rashly*?" We all make necessary judgements every day (we call them "decisions") but we must do so in humility, knowing that—even through we sometimes have to remove splinters from others' lives, we know we too have even bigger problems in our own lives, and hope others can help us remove those even as we help them to become saints. That's the "Fruit" Jesus talks about also in this Gospel.
