Walk for Life Next
Saturday One of the most exciting events of the year here in San Francisco is the annual Walk for Life West Coast. It's exciting to see 50,000 joyful young people (a few like me have young hearts but old hair) testify-

ing to real love. Why so many young people in the prolife movement? I think it's all about love. It is proper to youth to seek real love, and secularism is simply not delivering. To walk with this crowd is to swim in a sea of love and joy. I grew up attending the March for Life in Washington, DC, with my parish and my family. I've been attending the San Francisco Walk for Life since it began 14 years ago, riding in busloads from my former parish in Modesto and then Thomas Aquinas College in Ventura. Our parish has become one of the three "Walk for Life" parishes, offering lodging to hundreds of young people, sponsoring a free barbecue for the whole city, and bringing in the Sisters of Life from New York to give talks on Saturday night. Even if you can't make the Walk itself on January 26, come to the barbecue at 5pm in the schoolyard and auditorium. The Sisters of Life (including Jean and Arnold Low's daughter, Sr. Marija Joseph) will be leading giving a presentation in the church at 7pm and then leading a holy hour at 8pm. I'll keep the Blessed Sacrament exposed on the church altar all night long.


by Fr. Joseph Illo **Fishers of Men** (John 3:1-5, 10, 1 Corinthians 7:29-31, Mark 3:31-35)

Last week the Gospel told the story of Andrew and Simon's vocation from St. John Chapter 1. Jesus had invited them with the words "come and you will see." This week, from St. Mark's Gospel, Our Lord gives these two men their specific task as apostles: "you will be fishers of men." And that is what a bishop or priest does—he seeks souls. He thirsts not for popularity or money or success. He whole life is bent on saving souls.
