The Annunciation Today, March 25, is normally the Solemnity of the Annunciation, but Palm Sunday replaces it this year (we will celebrate Annunciation on April 9). One of my priest friends sometimes laments the fact that

March 25 is not a Holy Day of Obligation, and consequently few Catholics celebrate this great mystery. I too think the Annunciation should be an obligatory feast, but I am consoled by the fact this mystery stands at the head of the 20 mysteries of the holy rosary. The moment Our Lady said Fiat—"yes"— to all that God would ask of her, the Word became flesh inside of her and the gates of heaven were thrown open to all of us. Our Lady's Yes to God, and our Yes to God's will, stands at the head of all other grace-filled mysteries in our lives.



Palm Sunday But it is not Annunciation today. It is Palm Sunday. This is the day many more come to Mass, because after all we get something for "free" today, like we do on Ash Wednesday. We get a palm, and

unlike the ashes, the palms stay with us all year. The ashes proclaim the fact of death, and the palms proclaim the fact of Christ's Kingship over death. We slide our palms under the crucifixes on our walls to remember, every day of the year, that Jesus Christ reigns as king in our homes.
