Easter in 2 Weeks "I've not done very well in my Lenten practices so far...." Well, let's *sprint* this homestretch to Easter! Even if you haven't been very brave in fasting so far, focus on this Friday—perhaps just

tea and honey for breakfast. In the way of deeper prayer, maybe attend the Chrism Mass at the Cathedral this Thursday (5:30pm), the most wonderful Mass of the year, when the Archbishop gathers with all his priests and layfolk to consecrate the Holy Oils. If you haven't been very generous in almsgiving, make your gift to the Annual Appeal, which we conclude this weekend (perhaps 1% of our \$82K goal, if that is within your means). This week is called Passiontide in the older calendar, when statues and crucifixes are draped in purple. Holy Week itself will feature the haunting chants of Tenebrae, which replace the 7:30am Mass on Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday. Fr. Mathias and I have been practicing the sung Passion for Good Friday, and the *Exultet*, to be sung into the candlelit church at the Easter Vigil. You will receive our full Holy Week Schedule in the mail this week, with my Easter message and gift envelope. Without Lent, there is no Easter, so let's make this Easter bright by applying ourselves to these last two weeks of Lent. **Our School** You may have heard that our school is closing, which is not quite accurate.

The Archdiocese has decided, rightly, to suspend K-8 classes this coming year, due to low enrollment. Our Preschool is fully enrolled and will be unaffected. Some parents have expressed their anger over my plan to reintegrate the school as a ministry of the parish, and that anger has caused upset among other families. Please pray for our teachers, who will have to relocate to other Catholic schools next year, as well as our dear students, who have to do the same. Please pray for me, who am the target of much anger, and other parish and school leadership, all of whom are suffering. To flourish for many years to come, our parish school must again become a ministry of this flourishing parish. **AAA** This weekend we conclude the Annual Appeal. I thank those who have already made gifts toward our goal. Some are hesitant to support the Archdiocese after seeing how some bishops have failed in their pastoral duties. Our parish will have to write a check to the archdiocese for \$82,000 in any case, so if you don't give to the AAA, make your gift to the parish, and we will use it for the church renovation projects this summer. **Young Adults** Please pray for our Young Adults, who are on retreat this weekend. 


Be assiduous in the prayer of adoration and teach it to the faithful. It is a source of comfort and light, particularly to those who are suffering." - Pope Benedict XVI

Adoration requires at least two adorers signed up per hour. Many hours still need a second committed adorer. Please sign up to ensure the Blessed Sacrament is always attended.

Adorers Needed:


