Happy Easter A bright and warm welcome to all of you visiting our parish this Easter Sunday, and affectionate Paschal greetings to our regular parishioners as well. Lent 2019 was a

good one, with deep prayers and bold penances. I was much encouraged that so many prayed our Friday Stations of the Cross with me, and the solid crowd of faithful souls at the Solemn High Mass for St. Joseph followed by our St. Patrick/St. Joseph dinner in the hall which was inspiring. There's a lot of good Christian energy in our parish, fueled by heartfelt devotion to Jesus! This Easter we baptize four adults at the Vigil, followed by our Easter Feast in the greenway. Many thanks to the archdiocesan seminarians who join us each year to sing halleluiahs to the risen Savior around blazing fires, eating and drinking the good things of God. *There's no party like a Catholic party because a Catholic party don't stop!* **125 Years** 2019 marks one hundred and twenty-five years since our parish was founded on a sandy trail out to the beach called Point Lobos Avenue (now Geary Boulevard). The current structure is the third building and we aim to give it a fresh coat of paint inside and out, if we can raise the money. If you haven't yet made an Easter gift to God,

Christ's Church is *indefectible*, and in that conviction we continue the good work our forebears began in 1894 on this spot. Our parish is growing, despite everything, and because of the Blessed Sacrament, which blazes from our main altar by day and from the adoration chapel by night. Every parish is a lighthouse because of the Presence of Christ shining from its tabernacle. Blessed are we who have been given a place within this ark of salvation. May the Good Lord grant you and your loved ones a Blessed and Happy Easter!




2019 AAA is Here!



we pray you that this candle,
hallowed to the honor of your name,
may persevere undimmed,
to overcome the darkness of this night.
Receive it as a pleasing fragrance,
and let it mingle with the lights of heaven.
May this flame be found still burning
by the Morning Star:
the one Morning Star who never sets,
Christ your Son,



"I can't help but think, might it awaken within the French people and the people of Europe a deeper sense of connection to the Christian faith--the faith that made that building possible?" Barron wondered aloud. "Will the loss of it awaken in people a reappreciation of the faith? My hope is yes."
