Each of the children had been issued a lit candle, both for the entrance procession and for their own personal procession to receive Our Lord. They approached the white-draped kneeler in the sanctuary with the flame of their faith burning brightly, and careful not to let the wind blow out their candles, they knelt. With what reverence and burning love, it seemed to me, they opened their mouths discreetly to receive the Body of Christ. Part of their concentration, actually, was focused on not dropping their candles. But this practical necessity manifested, even to them, the need to protect their faith from the gusts that will surely knock them about in years to come. May Our Lady of the Blessed Sacrament protect them!


