A Man Redeemed A few weeks ago I met a man at one of Mother Teresa's shelters in Costa Rica. Franco was born in Cali, Colombia, then controlled by drug cartels. When Franco was eight years old,

government soldiers arrived in his village, lined up all the adults, and gunned them down. "The machine gun fire cut my mother right in half, like this" he said, drawing a line across his lower abdomen. "And you saw this?" I asked. "Si Padre. All of us saw our parents killed, and we ran into the mountains. The FARC (a Marxist guerilla movement) gave each of us a machine gun." Franco held up a two-liter water bottle to represent his Kalashnikov, caressing it. "They said: this is your mother and your father. This gun is your god now." For 12 years he fought as a child soldier, and then he escaped to Panama, and finally to the mountains of Costa Rica. He appeared at the sisters' door one day and has been living at their shelter for five years. He finds day work and returns home every evening to shower and talk with his brother residents. "Sister Celine Paul saved me," he said. Franco has survived the violence and despair fueled by self-will, but now he has learned to trust God rather than himself. He radiates peace and joy, and he prays with the sisters every morning: "Mary, give me your Heart: so beautiful, so pure, so immaculate; your Heart so full of love and humility that I may be able to receive Jesus in the Bread of Life and love Him as you love Him."

Disruptive Street Folks "God's house shall be called a house of prayer for all peoples," and so the Catholic Church is the most welcoming, inclusive, and accepting

place on earth. Everyone is welcome at Star of the Sea to pray, and to become a part of our family of families. The government and the social media corporations talk about inclusivity, but in fact City Hall and Facebook and Google are rather exclusive. These big corporations do a lot of good for the poor, but they do not welcome street people into their buildings. It is churches and general hospitals that welcome everyone off the street, meeting people where they are at. I appreciate you all for sharing our beautiful church with street people who often do not know exactly how to behave in church. I thank our staff and priests, who feed the homeless every day at our rectory door, and sometimes referee fights between them. If a stranger, perhaps afflicted with a psychotic illness, becomes belligerent in our church, please do not return the aggression, lest you escalate tensions and perhaps get hurt. Speak calmly but firmly to a disruptor, and call the parish office. If the person is becoming violent, dial 911. The local police are quick to respond, God bless them! Welcoming people is hard work and carries a degree of risk, because everyone is wounded, and some worse than others. But in the end, this is God's house, and we will keep the doors open to this beautiful but wounded city. *Fr. Joseph Illo* www.frilloblog.com
