Our parish is the only church in San Francisco that offers Mass in the **Extraordinary Form** (Latin) every day, with a full Sung Mass on Sundays. Actually, however, we only offer this Mass six times a

week, and many have been asking me for a Latin Mass on Saturdays, the only day we don't offer a Latin Mass. Last Saturday, I did offer the 8:30am Mass the Extraordinary Form in response to these requests, but I didn't prepare folks for the change. I'm sorry for my imprudence.

While some were overjoyed to have at Latin Mass on Saturday morning, others objected that their "English" Mass was replaced by a language and form they didn't understand. Over the next few weeks, I'd like to point out the particular beauty of the Latin Mass for

those who have never been to one, or who are put off by Mass in a language they don't understand. Mass in the traditional form is certainly an acquired taste. I myself was taught in the seminary that the "traditional Mass" was gone forever, just a museum piece, a fetish for odd traditionalists. In 2007 Pope Benedict encouraged priests to learn the Extraordinary Form in order to understand the Mass more deeply, and to offer it for those who requested it. That same year I spent a week in Nebraska seminary for training and began offering this Mass in Latin every week in my parish. It was hard work, but through the

Extraordinary Form my worship took on a new depth. I beheld a beauty in the Mass I had never known. I want you to enter that depth and beauty as well. The Ordinary Form of the Mass is, well, the *ordinary* way we offer the Mass. Most of our Masses at Star of the Sea are in the Ordinary Form (in English), and I love Mass in both forms. But all Catholics should understand the Extraordinary Form, the Mass of **St. Francis** and **St. Philip Neri** and **St. Benedict**. My favorite saint, **Mother Teresa**, began her life with the Extraordinary Form, and when it changed in 1970, she was careful not to lose the reverence and simplicity of worship. She

switched to the Ordinary Form like everyone else, but she didn't replace the organ with guitars and drums; she didn't want priests to be showman in the Divine Liturgy, and she didn't want musicians and homilists to entertain her sisters at Mass. For

those of us who don't have the deep faith of Mother Teresa, the Extraordinary Form helps us regain a proper God-centered focus in the Mass. The mystical beauty and prayerful focus of our 11:30 Sunday Latin Mass draws people from all over (it is now our most-attended Mass). I am deeply grateful to our musicians, priests, sacristan and altar guild, and altar servers for the tremendous work you all put into that sacred liturgy. I would like all of us at Star of the Sea to take a careful and humble look at the Extraordinary Form of the Roman Liturgy, and I will be speaking more about it in the weeks to come. *Fr. Joseph Illo*
