**The Walk for Life West Coast** This Saturday San Francisco becomes a festival of life and love as well over 50,000 witness to the supreme gift of every human life gather at City Hall. Legalized abortion in 1973 has led

to the destruction of 60 million human lives. Admittedly many of those human persons were small enough to fit in the palm of your hand, and some even small enough to sit on a flower petal. But since when does "small" mean "not valued" or "not human"? *A person's a person no matter how small.* If size determines how human we are, then short people are less human than tall people. But if an unborn person, a "fetus," is even possibly a human being, we should do all we can to nurture, support, and protect this little creature unless we find positive proof that he or she is not human. **A Parish School** Our parish hopes to reopen our school in August 2021 as a Classical School. Our School Board has identified a consultant who will begin our feasibility study in a month or two. If you have children from age two to thirteen and would like to explore the possibility of sending your children to San Francisco's first Catholic Classical School, call me in the office. I want to have a meeting of interested parents in early February. **Why Latin?**

Some of you would attend Mass in the Traditional Form if it were not in Latin, I suspect. Why pray in a dead language? Well, the Second Vatican Council directed all

Catholics to know at least the basic Mass prayers in Latin, such as the Lord Have Mercy, the Holy Holy Holy and the Lamb of God. But why Latin? Because Latin is the language of the Romans, and we are the Roman Catholic Church. Our roots are in Latin, and Latin is beautiful.

But even if you don't know a lick of Latin, it serves as a linguistic "veil" that indicates a mystery. The Mass should not be in street language, or casual syntax, or slang. The Mass is sacred, and needs at least a bit of a sacred language. So in the Traditional Mass the priest prays to God in Latin, and the people with him, although the scriptures are read in English, and of course he preaches in our mother tongue. *Fr. Joseph Illo*

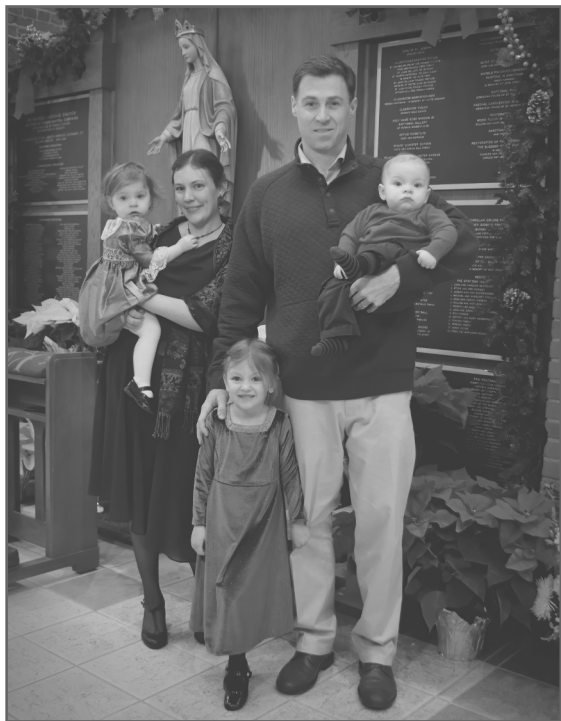
