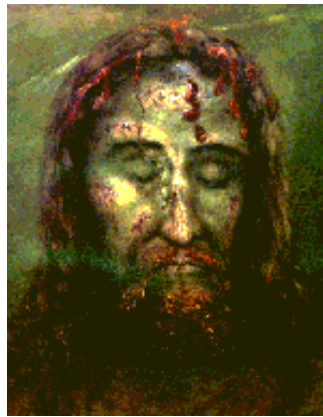


Holy Week We've come to the holiest week of the year, when we immerse ourselves in the core of the Christian faith. In a Christian culture, the businesses, schools, social

calendars—the entire economy of our society—becomes still and reflective from Palm Sunday to Easter Sunday.

“Let us go up to Jerusalem to die with Him,” the Apostle Philip said, and through the sacred liturgies we do just that. Our society is “post-Christian,” or even “post-post-Christian,” as Fr.

McTeigue put it in our final Lenten speakers' presentation last Tuesday. We rush on through Holy Week, as if Christ had not died, living lives of practical atheism, giving very little thought to the things of God. I've been reading a book about the Shroud of Turin, given me by a faithful parishioner for just this time of year. I encourage you to see for yourself, through online articles about the Shroud, *how* He died. Every forensic analysis of the Shroud reaches the same conclusion: no human artist or technology produced this image of a man stripped, beaten, scourged, and crucified. How the image inheres in the cloth, and how such an anatomically precise portrait of human trauma could be produced, is still a mystery. It is into this mystery that we enter in Holy Week, exploring the mystery of sacrificial love through sacred liturgy and personal prayer. Our triduum Mass schedule is on the back of this bulletin,

and in particular I recommend the haunting chants and prayers of *Tenebrae*, Latin for “darkness,” which we will conduct in place of the 7am Mass on Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday. This ancient service lasts 30 minutes, beginning in the dark but ending in the streaming morning sunshine.

Station Churches on Holy Thursday

Another ancient tradition from the City of Rome are the “Station Churches.” Every day of Lent a different church in Rome hosts the morning Mass, and on Holy Thursday pilgrims visit the “chapels of repose” of seven

churches. This Thursday, after the 6pm Mass of the Lord's Supper, I invite you to set off with me and the Colverts (thank you for organizing this pilgrimage Danielle) for seven San Francisco

Churches, including our Cathedral, St. Dominic's, SS. Peter and Paul, St. Patrick's, etc. Details on the back of this bulletin.

Stella Maris Academy



Classical education is an excellent way for middle school students to build a strong foundation for their future academic pursuits while deepening their love and understanding of the Catholic faith. This approach to learning emphasizes the study of the liberal arts which includes grammar, logic, and rhetoric. Fundamentally, a liberal arts

education seeks to unify the various disciplines through integration and by elevating them through the light of faith.

The study of rhetoric involves the art of effective communication, including the use of language, persuasion, and delivery, to influence or persuade an audience. At Stella Maris Academy, we partner with **Rose Debate** in order to offer a weekly speech and debate experience for all students in Grades 5 to 8. Over the past several months, students have practiced delivering prepared speeches with “clarity and projection,” as well as impromptu speaking skills. In preparation for a spring debate tournament, SMA students have been learning about the structure and format of formal debate.

These important rhetorical skills support the students’ written communication as well. Over the past two years, our students have done exceptionally well and have been recognized for their achievements in the Chapter, District, and Division Levels of the **Daughters of the American Revolution** Essay Competition.

This year, the topic was the Second Continental Congress and the signing of the Declaration of Independence. SMA students in 5th - 8th grade won at all levels of the competition: **5th Grade - Natalie A.** won the SF Presidio Chapter Award, the SF District III Award, and the California State Award. **6th Grade, Maria S.** won the SF Presidio Chapter Award, the SF District III Award, the California State Award, and the Southwestern Division Level Award. Her essay is now one of 8 essays in consideration for the final award, the National Award! **7th Grade, Lex D.** won the SF Presidio Chapter Award. **8th Grade, George A.** won the SF Presidio Chapter Award.

We are so grateful for the hard work of our faculty who guide our students in these tremendous achievements.



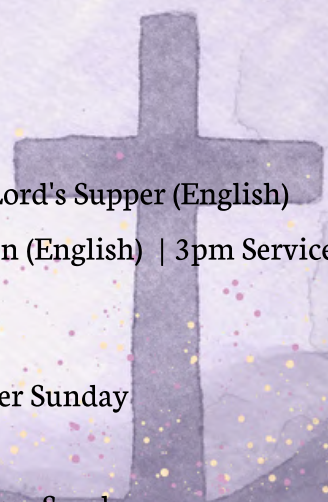
