Flowers for the Metropolitan The first time I entered the grand lobby of the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York City, I was amazed at its spectacular floral arrangements. In 1967, Lila Acheson Wallace bequeathed an endowment sufficient to provide an abundance

of fresh flowers every week in perpetuity, and each

week the museum's flowers change with the season. In April, for example, thick bunches of yellow forsythia arch ten feet over the visitor's desk. In May, it's lilacs, and roses in June. The twin niche urns in the back wall blossom afresh each Tuesday with lilies, peonies, dahlias, and chrysanthemums. The first time I saw these immense floral

arrangements, I didn't think they were real. I had never seen such quantities of freshly-cut flowers and could scarcely imagine how much they would cost. But Mrs. Wallace wanted every visitor to feel welcomed and cherished in New York City's greatest art museum. The Metropolitan contains many inspired works of art, among the world's most noble expressions of the human spirit. The most excellent of these artworks, however, manifest a beauty beyond human creativity; museum visitors often leave with a sense of God's grandeur. Flowers for Jesus and Mary In one sense every Catholic church is a museum of God's beauty, because God Himself dwells in every Catholic tabernacle, emanating goodness, truth, and beauty. Over 20 centuries, the Catholic Church has become the world's greatest patron of

the arts, inspiring, commissioning, and conserving superb music, painting, sculpture, textile, and every other kind of art. But let's consider

flowers, which are not works of human art; each flower, in its simplicity and unique beauty, is made by the hand of God. Bringing nature's beauty into our churches and homes lifts our spirits with God's own handiwork. People tell me how beautiful our church is, with fresh flowers at every shrine. I counted over fifty bouquets of flowers in the church and chapel last week, with 30 or so potted plants. We are a veritable

arboretum Dei, God's florist shop! Cut flowers, however, are especially inspiring, because they represent a sacrifice. The flowers are cut, offering (as it were) their lives to honor God, the giver of all life. In the Old Testament, the people offered animal sacrifices, which were ritually drained of blood with a cut to the throat, and then cut in pieces to be wholly

consumed at the altar of sacrifice. Christ's sacrifice on the Cross ended animal sacrifices, but we remember His Sacrifice, and our little sacrifices, by **STAFF** offering freshly-cut flowers now on His altar. My many thanks, and admiration, go to our Altar Guild, and the many who donate flowers every week for our altars and shrines. Corpus Christi The Feast of Corpus Christi used to be celebrated on a Thursday, because it was on a Thursday that Our Lord offered His Body and Blood at the Last Supper. On Holy Thursday we processed with the Holy Eucharist inside the church, but on Corpus Christi (after Pentecost made possible the public proclamation of the faith) we take Jesus into the streets. For an excellent 3-minute video by Grassroots Productions, google "God in the Streets of New York." Today every Mass will be a Corpus

# The Sunday Scriptures

Most Catholics, according to the polls, do not believe in this foundational doctrine. But for those of us who do, we must receive His Body with utmost reverence, and we must become what we have received.




