The Holy Spirit The "Synod for Synodality," a meeting of clergy and laity to discuss current issues facing Catholics, is underway in Rome. We pray that the Holy Spirit will guide these discussions in accord with God's perfect will. Pope Francis has often asked us to pray

to the Holy Spirit during this synod because the "spirit of the age," what St. Paul calls the "spirit of this world" and St. John calls "the spirit of antichrist," is also present in church meetings. Anyone who has participated in parish or diocesan meetings is painfully aware how an obtuse spirit seeks to frustrate our good intentions: our meetings are often marred by envy, annoyance, rivalry, arrogance, and personal ambition. It's a good idea, therefore, to begin every meeting with a prayer to the Holy Spirit. Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of thy faithful.

The Obtuse Spirit This is especially true of the Synod in Rome. Wouldn't the evil spirits just love to derail a decision-level meeting of bishops and cardinals? This has happened from the very first meetings of Church leaders, as you can read in Acts 15. Paul and Barnabas split up over their differences, and at Antioch St. Paul even had to correct St. Peter "to his face" (Galatians 2:11). Peter, in his great humility, accepted Paul's correction, and we must all realize that only God is perfect. In our own time, just as in the early Church, that nasty "obtuse spirit," opposing the Holy Spirit, is afflicting the Church. One painful example of how the spirit of this age is influencing the Church is in the question of blessing same sex unions, which some bishops in Germany and other countries are being permitted to do. A Catholic blessing on a human act—such as a marriage or a grape harvest or a beginning of the school year-proclaims the

goodness of the act and asks God to make it prosper. Natural friendships must be managed with delicacy, because while mutual support and affection

are good, sexual acts between unmarried friends is bad. The spirit of this world has so desensitized us that many Catholics today think of sexual acts as a normal part of any friendship. We have lost a sense of reverence for the sacred gift of the marital act. But human nature does not change, nor does God's law. Sexual acts between unmarried persons, and especially between members of the same sex, is gravely sinful. The Church cannot bless sin, and that is why Pope Francis published a prohibition on same-sex blessings two years ago (in an instruction from the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith, March 15, 2021: "Question: Does the Church have the power to give the blessing to unions of persons of the same sex? Response: Negative").

A Sign of Contradiction What if a bishop encourages his priests to bless same sex unions, as some are doing in Germany? The priest, and the laity, must appeal to the Church's sacred deposit of faith, which cannot follow the spirit of the age. This Faith will be a sign of contradiction to a disordered world. Our difficult moment is not a time to leave the Church. We must, rather, defend our Mother, even from some of her own bishops. In the 4th century, St. Athanasius was one of the few bishops who had not fallen into the Arian heresy. With firm courage, he insisted on right doctrine, and so must we. Like the Arian crisis then, our difficult moment will pass. The ship will right itself, and we must still be on that ship after the storm passes. We must not allow clergy who have fallen into error, even those at the highest levels, to drive us out of the Church. We, and our children, have a right and a need for the saving truths that only the Catholic Church can provide. We must stay with Holy Mother Church, and defend her. God grant us the wisdom and fortitude to do so. On October 24, at 7pm, I will address






