Welcome to Advent! A new liturgical year begins today, and we enter the wondrous season of Advent to prepare for the Nativity of Our Savior. Some of you may have already put up fragrant pine trees in your living

rooms, but please

remember that they are "Advent Trees" until December 24th!
Between obligatory "Christmas parties" over these next four weeks, we must make a real effort to fast, pray, and give alms to prepare for Christ's Second Coming. You might gorge yourself at a party (although you don't have to!), but you should also skip a meal or two, give something to the poor, and commit to some regular prayer (daily Mass, daily rosary, Eucharistic adoration, devotional reading, etc.) during

Advent. All of life is an Advent, after all, from

cradle to grave, as we prepare to meet Christ when He returns as supreme judge and redeemer.

Advent Mission This
Friday Sr. Donata and Sr.
Gaudia arrive from
Washington, where they
staff the Shrine of John Paul
II in our nation's capital.
They will give a full day of
recollection this Saturday,
beginning with Holy Mass
at 8:30am, and ending with

the chaplet of Divine Mercy at 3pm. Setting aside this Saturday for the things of God by attending this mission would be a very nice gift to the baby Jesus this year! Many thanks to our parishioners who put me in touch with these Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy, the religious order of St. Faustina Kowalska. These "daughters of St. Faustina" will focus their talks on Christ's Divine Mercy and Our

Lady, Mother of Mercy. On Sunday Sister Donata will lead an "hour of mercy" in the auditorium from 3-4pm, and at 4pm the Archbishop will lead a Marian Prayer Service in the church with music by the Benedict XVI Institute.


Simbang Gabi Another Advent devotion is the

traditional Filipino Advent Mass known as Simbang Gabi ("Night Mass"). Our Deanery (local cluster of parishes) will offer nine Masses leading up to Christmas Eve, each in a different church. You can see the full schedule on the back page of this bulletin, and Fr. Konopik will offer our Simbang Gabi Mass on December 14 at 6pm.

Rorate Caeli Another beloved Advent Mass is the *Rorate Caeli*, meaning "let the Savior descend like dew from heaven," the prophecy of the Messiah from Isaiah 45:8. This Mass, held

before dawn in a church lit only by candles,

honors Our Lady
during Advent as she
carries her divine
pregnancy to birth at
Christmas. I will offer
our Rorate Caeli Mass
at 7am on December
14, and Fr. Rocha will
assist the Archbishop in
the Cathedral's Rorate
Caeli Mass at 5am on
December 19. Finally,
this Friday is a holy day
of obligation, the **Feast**



Conception. Masses will be at 7am in Latin, noon in English, and 6pm a Solemn High Mass in Latin with Fr. Vincent Woo preaching. Our Lady of Guadalupe Masses will be on December 12 at 7am in English (followed by a Mexican breakfast with the school children in the auditorium), noon in English, and 6pm in Latin. Fr. 
