Cathedral Children's Choir Debut Led by Cathedral Music Director Christoph Tietze, the Cathedral Children's Choir will sing at our 9:30 Mass this Sunday. Sorry it has to be in the gym while we refinish our church floor, but we will be back in the church by Easter. The

children will be "invested" in their choir robes in a formal ceremony at Mass today.

AAA Also at Mass today we see the Annual Archdiocesan Appeal video and I ask you to pledge your support for our Archbishop. If you can, pledge 1% of that \$120,000 we want to put into the hands His Excellency, especially for our seminary. 1% would be \$1200, which many of us have been able to do. But if you can't do that, do more or do less, but do something! The real goal is 100% participation from all of us who are beneficiaries of the Archbishop's ministries.

Why Fast? That's what people ask Catholics in Lent, who in any case are not very good at it. But why even make the effort, when modern supply chains deliver all the food, drink, clothing, and social media one could want? There are many reasons to fast, not least of which is the biblical teaching, but I think the essential reason for fasting is so that we don't forget God. It's so easy to miss Him, especially when He is hiding (He likes to play hide-and-seek). It's so easy to forget about God when we are thinking about food nonstop while glued to our screens. When life is difficult, and God is silent, we naturally

turn to "things" to fill the vacuum—food, travel, social media, smoking—anything to fill the emptiness. Fasting, however, is staying with God in the solitudes, not panicking, not drowning the silence with food and

entertainment. The most

perfect form of fasting is

from food, but probably the more important fasting in our

time is from artificial media. Food used to be the best means available to fill the void, but now we have endless artificial worlds with which to fill our minds. I managed to fast from two meals on Ash Wednesday, but the most essential fast for me, every Lent, is from media. No music, no podcasts, no videos for forty days. Last Sunday, my fourth day of "silence," when I usually listen to a podcast as I wash up, I heard a bird singing on Geary Boulevard. I don't remember hearing any birds on Geary Boulevard before. And in that bird's voice, I heard the voice of its creator, calling to me, filling my mind with joy and hope. My silence had created a space for that bird's song—for that blessed voice of the Creator.

Ann Russell Miller was a San Francisco socialite who became a Carmelite nun. Heiress to three impressive fortunes (the Southern Pacific Railroad, Folger Coffee, and Pacific Gas and Electric), Ann left all her money and her San Francisco mansion overlooking the Bay to their ten children upon the death of her husband in 1984. She held a party for 800 guests at the San Francisco Hilton, after which she boarded a plane for a Carmelite monastery in the Midwest. Why did she do it? After her husband died, Ann realized that she needed greater silence to hear the voice of God, and more space to feel God's presence. So she fasted from everything she owned—gave it all away—and received a greater joy in return. We fast because we desire a greater purity and joy.


