**Divine Mercy** Today is the Sunday within the Easter Octave, also known as "Low Sunday," or "Whitsun," or "Divine Mercy Sunday." You will notice the larger-than-life picture of Jesus in the sanctuary today, the image of Divine Mercy, with the words "Jesus,

I trust in You" below his feet. The good news we preach is that Mercy has overcome fear, and we live under friendly skies. Join me, if you can, at 3pm today for a festive Mass of Divine Mercy, preached by our dear friend, Fr. Joseph Homick. I will be in the confessional during Mass dispensing the Sacrament of Mercy, and we will all sing of His mercy after Mass in the chaplet given to St. Faustina. A blessed day today, almost as wonderful as Easter itself!

Nine New Novices Five men, three women, and one boy were reborn in holy baptism last Saturday at the three-hour Easter Vigil, and four others received full initiation into the Catholic Church. Two more men will be baptized in the weeks to come (one of them, Ed Katz, will be baptized this Sunday). For this we give thanks to God and we pray for these newly-baptized and confirmed members of our community. They are novices in the faith, although given our stellar RCIA program, they know

more about the bible and the catechism than most Catholics. Still, they have not gone through the ups and downs in the Church that we cradle Catholics have experienced, so continue to pray for their perseverance.

**Choosing Their Lanes** This year saw more than twice as many men baptized than women. It's certainly encouraging to see adult men requesting the sacraments and submitting in humility to the authority of the Church. While we rightly lament the "failure of fathers" and the "missing of manhood" in our time, it's quite bracing to see men standing up for Christ and kneeling down for baptism. These men are choosing their lane, and may God bless them!

**Renting a Theatre** Many of you have seen one or more of the documentary series Mass of the Ages on the Traditional Latin Mass. Yours truly, along with many of our servers, are featured in Part One of this series, and I have a cameo appearance in Part Two, and now Part Three is out (I'm not in this one, but our local Jesuit, Fr. Joseph Fessio, has a prominent part). The 90-minute movie became available online a few weeks ago, and I watched it. It's OK on a computer screen, but the movie was

made to be seen and heard in a theatre (the soundtrack was mixed for theatre audio). I want to watch it again in one of the local cinemas. The director, Cameron O'Hearn, is willing to fly out to meet folks who rent a theatre, so that is what we did. We've rented the Regal Galleria at Stonestown on Tuesday, April 30, for a 7pm showing. We are asking \$25 per ticket, but you can pay what you can through their website. 220 tickets at \$25 will recoup our expenses, but I

don't want anyone (especially families) to stay away for money reasons. "Don't worry about money,"

Mother Teresa said. "God has lots of it." You can obtain tickets through the Mass of the Ages website, www.latinmass.com.
