Revival of Priestly Community This Wednesday a wonderful French priest, Fr. Henri Vallançon (cousin of our esteemed parishioner Gregoire Vallançon) will speak on a fascinating project. La Lucerne Abbey was founded in 1164 as a community of "canons regular"-

priests living in community at the local cathedral. I've longed for such a community of priests here in Northern California all of my priesthood. In France, the "eldest daughter of the Church," this renewal of the priesthood is underway. You can see another revival of Catholic culture in France in the movie *Mass of the* Ages, Part III, at the Stonestown Regal Cinema this Tuesday at 7pm (givebutter.com/sanfran). Lucerne Abbey flourished for 800 years, with 650 priests over that time, but was destroyed during the French

Revolution. Today Fr. Henri and Fr. William are rebuilding the abbey as a community of priests and a center for prayer, arts, and culture.

The Renaissance of a French Abbey While

France-the "eldest


daughter of the Church"-has given birth to powerful atheist movements (the "Enlightenment," the French Revolution, the "modernist heresy"), she has also given birth to powerful Catholic saints and missionary movements (St. John Vianney, St. Therese, the St. Vincent de Paul Society, and the great missionary successes in Asia and Africa). Today, while France is officially "secular," it leads Europe's prolife movement and has produced splendid fruits, from the Magnificat magazine that many of us use every day, to the Fraternity of St.

Peter and the Institute of Christ the King, to various lay initiatives. "The Lucerna Project" in Normandy, 25 miles from the famous Mont Saint Michel Abbey, is one of those revivals. Two years ago Bishop Laurent entrusted the abbey to Fr. Henri and Fr. William for a spiritual and cultural center. They are rebuilding the church and constructing a retreat center, complete with solar

> power and vegetable gardens. They've gathered families around the old abbey, formed a children's choral society, and sing lauds and vespers daily in Gregorian chant. They are reviving the traditional Latin liturgies and providing spiritual formation for young adults and families. You will be much encouraged to hear Fr. Henri speak about this flowering of Catholic culture this Wednesday after the 6pm Mass of St. Joseph the Workman (after whom our Knights of Columbus Council is named). I

> > will offer a sung Latin Mass at 6pm on Wednesday, and then at 7pm Fr. Henri will speak for 40 minutes about his Projet Lucerna. Of course, there will be wine and cheese! 30
