
The Ascension Last Thursday was Ascension Thursday, the fortieth day after Easter. I've often recalled how, in the 1970s, my mother would take all six of us

children out of public school on Ascension Thursday for a hike and picnic in the mountains. Those mountaintop experiences instilled in me a love for climbing and ascending to the heights. Everyone's desire to "climb" orients them for our final climb up the mountain of Purgatory

into Heaven. You may know that Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati will be canonized next year, and his famous saying was verso l'alto, or "to the heights!" Pier Giorgio loved to climb the alps of Northern Italy, where he grew up, but more fundamentally by verso l'alto he meant "towards heaven!" The mystery of the Ascension (the Second Glorious Mystery) points us toward the supreme summit of our lives, where Christ reigns with the Father and the Holy Ghost, his holy Mother beside Him, and all the angels and saints. That, my friends, is where we all must go to, and so ... verso l'alto!

Novena to the Holy Spirit Our parish is most blessed to be able to follow the older calendar,

along with the newer calendar (the best of both worlds!). That is how we were able to celebrate the Ascension on the day it actually happened. Fr. Konopik celebrated a quiet Mass of the Ascension last Thursday at 7am, and Fr. Rocha celebrated a sung Mass of the Ascension at 6pm. Celebrating the Ascension on Ascension Thursday also gives us the great benefit of beginning the Novena to the Holy Spirit nine days before Pentecost, which will be next Sunday, the great conclusion to our 100 days of Lent and Easter. I emailed everyone with the novena

prayer last week, but if you have not yet begun the novena to the Holy Spirit you can get going today. Pray that prayer every day, as the Apostles did in the Upper Room with our Lady, begging God to send the Holy Spirit upon the Church. We need the Holy Ghost now more than ever, so pray for this supreme gift. Let us pray: Come O Holy Spirit, Fill the hearts of Your faithful, and enkindle in them the fire of Your love. Send forth Your Spirit, and they shall be recreated, and You shall renew the face of the earth. O, God, who by the light of the Holy Spirit, did instruct the hearts of

the faithful, grant us by the same Holy Spirit to be truly wise and ever to rejoice in His consolations, through Christ Our Lord. Amen.

May Crowning Next Sunday is not only Pentecost, but also First Holy Communions for our Stella Maris and homeschool children. At our monthly 9:30 school Mass next Sunday, several students will receive the Holy eucharist for the first time, and one of them will be lifted up to crown the statue of Our Lady of Grace, blooming with dozens of roses. This statue goes back to the 1950s, when it was placed in our school (then overflowing with 400 students). Today this statue stays in our adoration chapel,

but for the month of May she takes her place in the sanctuary as the most venerable statue of Our Lady in our parish.

Eucharistic Pilgrimage Finally, today (Sunday) you are invited to walk with the Archbishop from the Cathedral to the Golden Gate Bridge, carrying the Blessed Sacrament on the first leg of its journey to Indianapolis for the nation's Eucharistic Congress in July. We depart from the Cathedral at 12:30pm today. Fr. Joseph Illo



The 13th Day In a world torn apart by persecution, war, and oppression, three children in Fatima, Portugal, were chosen by God to offer an urgent message of hope to the world. Based on the memoirs of the oldest seer, Lucia Santos, and many thousands of independent eye-witness accounts, The 13th Day dramatizes the true story of three young shepherds who experienced six apparitions of Our Lady between May and October 1917, which culminated in the final prophesied Miracle of the Sun on October 13. Abducted from their homes, thrown into prison, and interrogated under the threat of death in the government's attempt to silence them, the children remained true to their story about the crucial messages from Mary of prayer, repentance, and conversion for the world. We would recommend Parental Guidance and that parents preview it before watching with children.






