Archbishop Cordileone carried the monstrance aloft with Our Lord riding high above the waves as throngs (at least 3000) followed in His wake. 150 of us came from Star of the Sea, walking the entire way from our parish to Marin County and back, about four hours (including the Archbishop's rosary and benediction on the north side

of the Bridge). This was a grand Corpus Christi procession, and last Thursday Pope Francis led a similar Eucharistic procession from Saint Mary Major Basilica in Rome to Saint John Lateran. We did too, as did thousands of parishes around the world on the traditional celebration of Corpus Christi, which is the Thursday after Trinity Sunday. We will carry Our Lord into the streets again today, after the 9:30 and 11:30 Masses. But why Corpus Christi on Thursday? Because on Holy Thursday we carried the Eucharist in procession *inside the church* as Christ walked alone with his apostles after the Last

Supper to the Garden of Gethsemane. But now, after Pentecost, the Church has been inflamed and emboldened to proclaim the Kingship of Christ to all the world. We take Christ into the streets of our cities, blessing believer and atheist alike, showering His Eucharistic graces upon all the world. This is what "Eucharistic Revival" means: to believe in Christ the Savior's Body and Blood enough





neighbors; not just to keep the faith but to spread it. This is to be a Eucharistic People, not hiding Jesus behind locked church doors but bringing Him into the streets! So many of my priest friends are doing this today, even getting permission from the local police to close streets for our Eucharistic processions. Let us rejoice and be glad that He is with us, and He is with the City of San Francisco!


Is it all Greek to you? Yes, it is! And Roman too!
