The purpose of the sabbatical was to write two books, but it also afforded me the tranquility to read 18 books, taking copious notes on most of them in order to write my own book. It is Mother of the Light, analyzing eighteen of the most important With Brother Edmund, who spent apparitions of Our Lady. The first draft weighs in at 63,000 words, or about 230 pages. The book will have about

twenty-five illustrations, most from our shrine statues seen in striking plays of light and camera angle from a gifted photographer. I finished my other book as well, a history of our parish from 1776-2026, just in time for the 250th anniversary of Catholicism in San Francisco next year. This more modest book, entitled Sacred Star of the West, came in at about 110 pages and should be available early next year. The book on Our Lady will need more editing and will not be available, God willing, until the end of next year. I wish to thank all our priests, including guest priests

Fr. Edwin and Fr. Theo, and our three full-time priests Fathers Michael, Javier, and James, for continuing to provide Word and Sacrament to our bustling community. Fr. James, in particular, delayed his planned vacation so I could

# A MESSAGE FROM FATHER JOSEPH ILLO

I want to encourage each of you to participate in our Eucharistic Rosary Congress the week of October 28 to November 4. These eight days will be nonstop prayer before the Blessed Sacrament with a rosary every hour, and talks every day in both Spanish and English. Will you sign up for one hour this week before Our



Savior in the church, and to lead a rosary at the top of your hour?

The Eucharistic Rosary Congresses began in Poland just after John Paul II became Supreme Pontiff. The communist government would not allow him to freely visit his home country, so the

Polish people did a weeklong vigil at their national shrine of Our Lady of Czestochowa. By God's supreme power, through Our Lady's intercession, the communist government's directives were reversed, and in June 1979 John Paul spent "nine days that changed the world" in Soviet-occupied Poland. Thus began the process that would liberate Poland, Russia, and all of Eastern Europe from atheist communism.

We do not live under a totalitarian regime, thanks be to God. But we need God just as much as the Polish people did in 1978. For example, "deaths of despair" (suicide, drug overdose, and street violence) is now the leading cause of death for young people. We simply cannot live as free and happy people without God. I'm asking you, who are reading these words, to commit to one hour of prayer in our church, before the Blessed Sacrament, and to lead a rosary at the beginning of your hour. The most meritorious hours are between 10pm and 7am, but you can sign up for any hour during that week. You will make reparation for sin, console your God, and advance in holiness during your hour with Christ. Fr. Javier Ravasi and I will be giving talks on The Eucharist, Our Lady, and other Catholic topics throughout the week. You can see the full schedule at
