North American Martyrs October 19 is the feast day of the North American Martyrs, Saints Isaac Jogues, John de Brébeuf, and six others, although Sunday replaces the feast today. These Jesuits came from France to live in

unbelievably austere conditions with the native Americans of what became upper New York State and lower Canada. I recommend the recent biography of John de Brébeuf by Fr. Francis Talbot, published by Ignatius Press, which filled me with wonder at "the giant young Norman" who evangelized the Iroquois and Mohawk peoples, learning their language and customs, and sharing their lives. An extraordinary love drove these men across the Atlantic in 1625 to live and die in such

an arduous mission. Even a brief reading of these martyrs will reward you (Wikipedia's article on the "Canadian Martyrs" is a good start). In Rome, seminarians from the United States study at the North American College, and their soccer team is called the "North American Martyrs." When I studied there forty years ago, the American seminarians bravely faced

various European and South American seminary soccer teams. They routinely got slaughtered, so I think their team name was apropos. I think they are playing a better game these days....

Eucharistic Rosary Congress We are just a week out from the great Eucharistic Rosary Congress, which begins at 12 midnight on October 28. I will lead the first rosary at 12 am, to be followed by a rosary on the hour every hour for the next eight days, for a total of ninety-six public rosaries over the week. Each will be prayed by a brave soul, many in the wee hours of the night, which is the most effective and meritorious time to come before God. I am a light sleeper, and at

times parish or school concerns wake me at 2 or 3 am, and I often go into the chapel for a holy hour rather than toss and turn. I never feel tired the day after an hour with Christ in the silence of the night, despite an hour or two fewer of sleep. For many years, when I was younger, I had a holy hour every Sunday at 1am in a neighboring parish. It was hard to maintain every week, but I didn't feel sleepy the next day. Daylight Savings time occurred during one of my Sunday 1 am holy hours: I watched in fascination as the automatic wall clock went backwards from 2 am to 1 am. I got to spend a whole other hour with Jesus that night! I don't remember being particularly tired at all the Sunday Masses the next day....

Jesus and Mary The most important charism of this parish is Eucharistic worship, and the second most important charism is the rosary. Mary will keep us close to her Son if we pray the rosary well.

> It's so simple: these two things, the Eucharist and the Rosary, will take us to heaven. The Eucharistic Rosary Congresses began in Poland after John Paul II's nine-day visit in 1979 that began the process of liberating Europe from Soviet totalitarianism. Thanks be to God, and the world leaders who have helped bring it about, that the war in the Holy Land seems to be over, but Russia's war in Ukraine grinds on. The **Eucharistic Rosary Congresses** were formed in Poland to beg God for an end to the Cold War, and through the people's prayers, Poland and the other occupied nations became free. But the **Eucharistic Rosary Congresses** continue, with fifty in the United States alone this year. Make it a point to spend at least one hour before the Blessed Eucharist next week. 
Participation & Invitation to Prayer
