All Saints and All Souls
November is one of my
favorite months because we
swim in seas of holiness
with the saints and the
holy souls, soaring among
the great cloud of witnesses
who have gone before us to
God, both those in heaven

and those in purgatory. Bring in pictures of your faithful departed for our All Souls altar beneath the loving gaze of Our Lady, come to daily Mass to pray for their souls; pray the rosary for their consolation and to prepare for our own death. As I get older (coming up on 64!), I'm looking forward

with greater intensity to my own journey through death's portal to eternal life. I hope and I pray that I will make it to the finish line with my faith intact. St. Therese, and so many of the saints, tell us not to settle for purgatory, but to believe that God will take us straight to heaven if we are serious about our sanctification on earth. Total surrender to His perfect will, in loving trust, has brought so many before us straight to heaven. May it be so with us too!

Requiem Masses Today's Mass is All Souls in the newer calendar, and in the old calendar we will celebrate the Mass of All Souls tomorrow (on Monday). One of the blessings of a "bi-ritual" parish, with both newer and older forms of the Mass, is that we often get to celebrate the great feasts twice. In

fact, this coming week will have lots of beautiful requiem Masses for all the holy souls in purgatory—many of our parents, grandparents, friends and relatives. Most of the English and Latin Masses all this coming week will be Masses

who have not died, but have returned to God.

Jesus and Mary I write these words the morning after I began our Eucharistic Rosary Congress by praying a first rosary in the chapel at 12am. I actually went to bed at 9pm the night before, setting the alarm for 11:45pm, and when I stumbled into the chapel at 11:55pm Monday night, I found twenty people already there (including a whole family with eight kids—the Dumlao family, of course!). Five minutes later, at

12am Tuesday morning, I began the rosary, with decades in English, Latin, and Spanish. I am so happy to report that my parishioners didn't miss a beat. They made the responses, together,

prayerfully and robustly, in English, and in Latin, and (most of them) in Spanish. Our parish is truly educated in the Catholic religion, capable of praying the rosary in many languages, and especially in the sacred language of the Church (Latin). Thank you all for praying the rosary in the presence of the Presence, Our Lord in the Blessed Eucharist. By the time you read these words, Fr. Peter

Prusakiewicz will have come and gone (God bless him!), we will have already processed with the Eucharist from the Cathedral to Star of the Sea, already celebrated the Solemn High Pontifical Mass with our Archbishop, and already prayed 60 public rosaries in front of the Blessed Sacrament. There are still two days of our Congress to go, so if you have not yet prayed a

rosary in community in church or chapel (every hour on the hour), or heard one of our talks on the Catholic catechism, you can still get a little bit of our Congress: full schedule on our parish website. *Fr. Joseph Illo*


EUCHARISTIC ADORATION

devotion to the Blessed Sacrament, which he attributed to his ever deepening desire to grow in the Faith and serve those most marginalized in society. He was the first Black saint to be canonized in the Americas.


