
before. In this mysterious unity of Eucharist and Rosary we find our most effective weapons for waging peace.

The Sunday Scripture

The Dedication of the Lateran Basilica Ez 47:1-2,8-9,12; Ps 46:2-3,5-6,8-9; 1 Cor 3:9c-11,16-17; Jn 2:13-22. The waters flowing from the temple, the dwelling-place of the Lord, bring forth life and growth. Jesus is the living sanctuary, and we his living body in the Spirit. This day marks the anniversary of the dedication of the cathedral church in Rome, on November 9 of the year 324.

EUCHARISTIC ADORATION Last week, we celebrated St. Martin de Porres. This week we celebrate the feast of St. Martin de Tours, on November 11, called Martinmas. In Europe, they have processions, led by a horseman symbolizing St. Martin de Tours. Children carry candles and receive gifts. St. Martin de Tours is known for giving half his cloak to a shivering beggar. That night, he dreamt the



beggar was Jesus. He called the Eucharist a "supreme Sign of God's love, Sacramentum caritatis" (the Sacrament of Charity)." 


