A Child of the Greatest **Generation** A longtime friend of mine is 86 years old, a bit fragile at this point, and living alone. She never married and has no children; her parish (not Star of the Sea) is her family, and in her later years she has given herself over to

pray and penance. She strives to accept the weaknesses of her body and the loneliness that comes with old age as a penance God permits for her greater good and the salvation of souls. She does her best to offer up the disorientation that a good Catholic who grew up in the forties and fifties feels in America, and in the Catholic Church, of 2025. My uncle grew up in New York and served in the Marines during World War II. On Veterans Day and throughout the year I would say "thank you, Uncle Frank, for serving our country." Of a melancholic temperament to begin with, he would shake his head and say "the country I served is long gone. I don't recognize the country I'm living in now."

One could argue over this point, but one must respect the estrangement many older folks feel who spent happy childhoods in a more peaceful, rational, and ordered time than ours. My friend heroically tries to offer her confusion and desolation to God.

The Vulnerable Elderly

One day, sitting at home alone, my elderly friend received an email from someone who said he was a U.S. Treasury agent. Her personal information, he said, had been hacked and she needed to call him immediately. As an agent of the U.S. government, he would help protect her assets and recover her identity. She googled the man's name and found, indeed, a Treasury agent with that name. She called him, and over the next two months they spoke often on the phone. He told

her that she must not speak to anyone about the recovery process he was taking her through lest it be compromised. If she wanted to keep her assets secure, she must trust him and not tell even her best friend what she was doing with him. He asked often about her physical health, her medical conditions, and her emotions, sympathizing and encouraging her. She knew this could be a scam, but she was drawn into the feelings of friendship and intimacy that he was developing in her. She told no one about her communication with this man, even when he had gained control of most of her assets. He swore her to secrecy, insisting that she trust him, trust the government, and trust God. Even when she said she was certain that he was scamming her, his voice continued to draw her in. When she said she would expose him, he threatened her with legal action. In the end, he took all of her money and then ghosted her. Believe Only One Voice Men, it is said, are seduced by the eye, and women by the ear. A man falls prey to what he sees (pornography), and a woman falls prey to what she hears ("sweet nothings" whispered in her ear). I've spoken much

to the men of my parish, sometimes from the

pulpit, about pornography. Now I speak to the women of my parish about the seductive voices that want to steal and abuse their hearts. Believe only one voice, that of

angel from heaven," St. Paul tells the Galatians, speaks a gospel other

than that of Jesus Christ, do not believe him. "My sheep know my voice," the Lord assures us. I say this to protect the vulnerable elderly, but all of us too. With the internet, the number of voices and images trying to draw us away from Christ is legion. We must not trust anyone who claims to be our savior. Only Jesus saves, and any words that contradict His Word is from the evil one. Fr. Joseph Illo
