Happy Christmas In England, where I studied for a year, they don't say "Merry" Christmas but *Happy Christmas*. This is not because English gentlemen are not merry but because Christmas is not just to be merry for a day. The

Incarnation of God among us gives us a glimpse of eternal beatitude, in the shining face of the newborn Son. A happy, blessed, and merry Christmas to all of you!

Darkness and Light Tomorrow is the darkest day of the year, the Winter Solstice. On December 13 we celebrated the Feast of St. Lucy, whose name means "light" in Latin. She was tortured around the year 304 in Sicily by having her eyes gouged out and has ever been the patron saint of those who suffer eye problems. A year ago I underwent eye surgery that did not go well, so my friends and I prayed a novena to St. Lucy. A friend had some miraculous oil from St. Sharbel's incorrupt body, and I also smeared it on my eyes. I've made novenas to St. Jude, St. Cecilia, and St. Joseph, but my vision remains darkened. One might be tempted, when we don't get "what we ask for" in prayer, to look elsewhere than God. But Lord, Peter said in John 6, "to whom else shall we go?" After 18 months of many ophthalmologist appointments, I do not have much hope in medical interventions, as impressive as they sometimes are. I have learned to live my disability, and even (on a good day) to offer it to God with joy. This is the miracle I've prayed for, even without knowing it: to remain joyful and peaceful in God's will. The miracle is that I still have my faith after all these years! The miracle is that any of us who have come to demand "next day delivery"—we white men who cannot wait in lines, we Karens who have become addicted to Instagram and

endless social media endorphins—the miracle is that any of us spoiled Americans have any faith in God at all. He makes us wait, sometimes a long time! The miracle is that we rejoice to know we are beggars at the throne of grace, that we don't own anything and are in no position to demand anything. It is ours to pray, to ask, to trust, and to wait upon God's ways. This is hard to do, but the miracle for which I thank St. Lucy is that I've given God my eyes, which are His anyway.

Manger Scenes I encourage everyone to set up a manger scene in your front window or in front of your domicile. The warmth of the creche gives passersby hope and joy in this darkest time of the year. A few men of the parish have put up our large outdoor manger scene on the steps of the church. Hay bales, 3-D, 3-foot shepherds and camels, a pinewood stable and picket fence, outdoor lighting—this Nativity Scene charms the onlooker. My office window looks down on the sidewalk in front of the church, but I can't actually see the Nativity Scene itself. What I've noticed, and what I love to see, are the passersby who stop to look. Some bow their heads, some make the sign of the Cross as they balance shopping bags,

some stop their bikes and regard it intently, and some simply peer at the tableau in curiosity. Some don't see it at all because they are staring at their cellphones (and that's quite sad), but I could stand at my window for hours and just look at the people of San Francisco looking at the Nativity. The scene itself so beautifully touching that few see it without receiving hope and joy. It's the perfect picture of the hearth, of the dear home for which we all long, because it portrays the perfection of the Holy Family. It's also perfect because it really happened; there really was such a family in Bethlehem 2024 years ago. So put up those manger scenes if you can—it's not too late—to help us believe that such love is possible, and that we all have a place in God's home.

The Sunday Scripture

Fourth Sunday of Advent (Is 7: 10-14; Rom 1: 1-7; Mt 1:

18-24) The Visitation The last Gospel before Christmas is the last mystery of the rosary before the Nativity. It is the Visitation of Our Lady to her cousin Elizabeth. The unborn John leaps for joy in her womb in the presence of the unborn Messiah, whom Mary carries to him in her womb. Today, pray the joyful mysteries, from the Annunciation to the Presentation in the Temple, and leap for joy with John the Baptist in the presence of Jesus and Mary!



EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION On December 26, we celebrate St. Stephen (trad). He was appointed by the first apostles to be a deacon, and is known as the protomartyr, or first martyr, for Christ. He was only 30 years old. Upon his stoning, mirroring Jesus, he was quoted, "Lord, do not hold this sin against them," and his final plea, "Lord Jesus, receive my spirit."

With St. Stephen's surrender and forgiving heart, and as we celebrate Christmas, let us sing and pray, "Oh come all ye faithful... come let us adore Him" in the Blessed Sacrament with a weekly holy hour commitment at
