**How to Distinguish a Mortal Sin from a Venial Sin?** This is a common question. We will try to be as pedagogical as possible, but first, let's define some terms. A sin is "any voluntary act against the Law of God" (as we learned in

the Catechism when we were children). For a sin to be mortal, it must kill or remove God's grace from the soul, and three conditions must all be present: **1) Grave Matter**, **2) Full Knowledge** (knowing that it is a sin and that it is grave) **3) Full consent** (freely choosing to do it). If any one of these is missing, the sin is not mortal, but venial, and therefore forgivable with an act of contrition and hatred for the sin out of love for God. **What is "grave matter"?** It means the act is seriously evil by its nature, not just a minor imperfection. It is something that separates us from God because we preferred a creature over the Creator. Examples of grave matter: sacrilege, heresy, apostasy, impurity (sins against the Sixth Commandment), hatred (not mere irritation), lies causing serious harm, stealing significant sums, knowingly missing Sunday Mass, consuming alcohol or drugs to the point of losing reason, etc. Examples of light matter: small impatience, slightly harsh words that do not cause serious harm, minor lies, fleeting bad thoughts immediately rejected. If someone is unsure whether the matter is grave, then it probably isn't, or the person lacks the knowledge needed to discern it. **Full Knowledge** For a sin to be mortal, it's not enough to do something wrong: one must know it is a grave sin. This excludes: Invincible ignorance (not knowing and unable to know it was grave), Sincere lack of knowledge (not deliberate ignorance), Confusion, fear, or emotional disturbance. Example: If someone did not know an action was gravely sinful, then it was not a

mortal sin due to lack of knowledge. **Full Consent** Even if the matter is grave and one knows it is wrong, the person must freely choose to do it, without being forced or overwhelmed by factors that reduce consent. Factors that diminish consent include: fear, sudden passions, strong temptation, anxiety, illness, addiction, sleepiness, or ingrained habits not fully overcome. A common saying:

"When the sin surprises you more than you surprise it, full consent is lacking." Questions to Ask Yourself if in Doubt: 1) Is the act objectively grave? If no → venial sin. 2) Did I clearly know it was

grave? If no → not mortal sin. 3) Did I freely choose it? If no → probably venial. **Practical Examples:** Sudden anger Act: someone lashes out with an angry word. **Grave matter?** Usually no (unless it severely humiliates). **Knowledge?** Yes. **Consent?** Partial (sudden passion). → **Venial sin.** Missing Mass without reason: "I won't go today because I don't want to." **Matter:** grave. **Knowledge:** yes. **Consent:** yes, free. → **Mortal sin.** Brief sexual temptation: A fleeting image or thought appears, but you do not consent fully. **Matter:** only grave if fully consented. **Knowledge:** yes. **Consent:** not full. → **Venial or no sin.** Lie without harm: Telling a small lie to avoid trouble. **Matter:** light. **Knowledge:** yes. **Consent:** yes → **Venial sin.** **Conclusion** A sin is mortal only if you can honestly say: "I knew it was grave and yet freely chose to do it." **Classic spiritual advice:** Moralists often recommend: if the soul doubts whether a sin is mortal, it probably isn't. Mortal sin requires full, conscious deliberation. This does not mean venial sins should be ignored; they must be hated wholeheartedly to reach Heaven. As an old Spanish rhyme says (adapted with rhyme in English): "God is watching every day, Keep in mind as you pray; Life will end, we cannot say, When the hour will come our way." Fr. Javier Ravasi

# The Sunday Scripture

**The Baptism of the Lord** (Is 42: 1-4, 6-7; Acts 10: 34-38; Mt 3: 13-17). On this second Sunday of the Christmas season, the Church presents us with the prologue of Saint John, the evangelist who is often symbolized as an eagle because of the sharpness of his theology and his lofty, vertical vision. There, in that traditional text, it says: "He came to His own, and His own did not receive Him. But to all who received Him, He gave the power to become children of God" (Jn 1:11-12). The Messiah of God, Emmanuel, God with us, was crucified by those who—of all people!—should have accepted Him as their God and Savior. Let us, Christians of the twenty-first century, not only always welcome Our Redeemer as the One who alone must be served, but also proclaim Him through our words and, above all, through the example of our Christian life.



**Eucharistic Adoration** We celebrate St. Marguerite Bourgeoys January 12. She was born in France and left to serve in Montreal, Canada. She formed the first uncloistered religious order, Congregation of Notre Dame, and she is the first female saint in Canada. She had a profound devotion

to the Eucharist and is quoted "Jesus waits for you in the Eucharist, in our tabernacles and monstrances, and on the altar at we every Mass."




