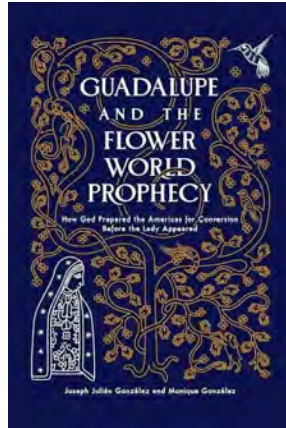


The Book I Read on Retreat

Last Sunday I preached the 9:30 Mass on what I had discovered in a remarkable book, Guadalupe and the Flower World

Prophecy, by Joseph and Monique Gonzalez. The book analyzes recent anthropological discoveries of indigenous philosophy and theology in Mesoamerica. Specifically, it describes the Nahua prophesy of a "singer-poet" who would journey to heaven and bring its mystical flowers to earth. I had read this book during my annual retreat with twenty other priests, most of whom were from Los Angeles, an Archdiocese greatly devoted to Our Lady of Guadalupe. The current Archbishop, Jose Gomes, has built a chapel to La Guadalupana in his cathedral which gives access to the only piece of Juan Diego's tilma in the United States. On this one-centimeter square from the cactus fiber garment on which Our Lady imprinted her image in 1531, one clearly sees the rough weave of a fiber that naturally disintegrates within twenty years. Like the full tilma in Mexico City, however, this piece has preserved its vitality since 1531. Archbishop Cordileone's Project Guadalupe 2031 is celebrating the 500th anniversary of the Guadalupe Event over the next five years to bring more attention to the greatest miracle in all of the Americas (go to www.projectguadalupe.org).

A Mayan Prophecy The Guadalupe and the Flower World Prophecy details how indigenous American religions, from the Olmecs in 1500 BC, to the Mayans in 900 BC, to the Teotihuacan civilization of 250 AD, to the Nahua nations of 950 AD, all believed in a paradise after death for those deemed "worthy." This "Flower World" would be full of the most precious flowers and exquisite birdsong, which for the native Americans of Mesoamerica were



pathways to the divine. Many "flower songs" were composed and performed in Nahua culture, but the most prominent of these is the cuicapeuhcayotl, the "Origin of All Song." This epic poem portrays their quest for divine truth through beauty, specifically through flowers (xochitl) and songs (cuicatl). Its poet-hero searches for heaven, guided by the golden hummingbird into the mythical "Flower World Paradise." He gathers its beautiful flowers into his tilma, as rare birds sing about him, and attempts to bring them back to

earth. But then he awakes and realizes he was only dreaming, that in fact he is not worthy to enter the Flower World. "Where would one whose worth is nothing get [these flowers]," he laments, "one who sins on earth? Indeed, it is the God of Far and Near who makes one worthy...." In the end, the poet-singer's heart weeps, for "a bad place is this earth." **Guadalupe: A Prophecy Fulfilled** In 1526, a small Nahua man, Juan Diego, received baptism. He was one of the few indigenous to do so, and in 1531 as he is on his way to Mass he hears exquisite birdsong and sees the cactus and mesquite glowing like bright flowers. "Where do I find myself?" he asks. "Is it possible that I am in the place our grandparents told about, in the land of flowers ... possibly in the land of heaven?" A beautiful woman calls to him, and he goes up the mountain, fills his tilma with flowers, and brings them back to earth. On his tilma appears the same queenly lady, and word began to race about Mesoamerica: the prophecy has been fulfilled. A man has been found worthy to enter the Flower



World, and he was made worthy by receiving baptism. People began to flood into the churches begging for baptism, such that ten million became Catholic within a few years, the greatest mass conversion in history. They traveled up to 200 miles, weeping, to receive the sacraments. I will continue this story in weeks to come.... *Fr. Joseph*

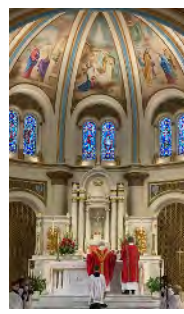
